RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Tazewell County Land Use Committee has reviewed the attached agreement with Municipal Addressing Services, Inc., to re-enter into a one year agreement beginning December 1, 2013, through November 30, 2014, for addressing services for the unincorporated areas of Tazewell County for a financial commitment as follows:

a) on or before March 1, 2014	\$800.00
b) on or before June 1, 2014	\$800.00
c) on or before September 1, 2014	\$800.00
d) on or before December 1, 2014	\$800.00

WHEREAS, the Land Use Committee recommends approval of the proposal submitted by Municipal Addressing Services, Inc., with the following amendments:

1. Remove language in its entirety from Section 1 (e);
2. Reword Section 1(c) to state the following:
 - (c) The Community Development Officer, or some other officer designated by the County Board, shall accept addresses established by Contractor. Contractor assumes all responsibility for and hereby agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Tazewell County, its officers, agents, employees, and attorneys against ~~any and all losses~~ Contractor's damages, liabilities, actions, suits, fines, proceedings, costs or any other expenses of any nature whatsoever that Tazewell County may incur or sustain or for which it may become liable (including, but not limited to, personal and bodily injury to, or death of, persons or damage to property) resulting from, arising out of or in any way relating to services provided by Contractor. The obligation to indemnify and hold harmless Tazewell County will survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Land Use Committee further approves the proposal with the following conditions:

1. Said contract shall be funded through the general revenue fund with said fund being replenished by fees collected through addressing applications accepted by the Community Development Administrator;
2. Said contract shall be subject to approval of the Community Development's Fiscal Year 2013-2014 Operating Budget by the Tazewell County Board;
3. Said contract may be terminated at any time by either party, with or without cause, upon ninety (90) days written notice to the other party.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Board approve this resolution and Contract as amended.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Clerk shall notify Steve Hullcranz of Municipal Addressing Services, Attorney Robert Brown, the Tazewell County Auditor and the Community Development Administrator of this action.

ADDRESS NUMBER(S) ASSIGNMENT SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT entered into this 20th day of November, 2013, in the City of Pekin, Illinois, by and between the **COUNTY OF TAZEWELL, ILLINOIS**, hereinafter referred to as "County," and **MUNICIPAL ADDRESSING SERVICES, INC.**, an Illinois corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Contractor":

RECITALS

(A) The parties did on the 29th day of November, 2006, enter into an Address Number(s) Assignment Services Agreement for a term of twelve (12) months from the date of said Agreement.

(B) The County wishes to continue to provide for efficient and orderly addressing in unincorporated areas of Tazewell County.

(C) The parties desire to enter into a one-year agreement for addressing services.

(D) Contractor reasonably estimates that approximately 50+ single addresses will be assigned during the period beginning December 1, 2013, and ending November 30, 2014.

(E) Contractor employs Stephen Hullcraz and provides such addressing services.

(F) That a Resolution was passed by the County Board authorizing the execution of an Address Number(s) Assignment Service Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

(1) **Purpose.** County engages the Contractor to furnish the services herein set forth, under the conditions and for the compensation herein stipulated, and Contractor accepts said engagement upon said terms. Contractor understands and agrees that the purpose of this Agreement is to assign addresses in unincorporated areas of Tazewell County as requested by the County.

More specifically, it is the understanding of the parties that:

- (a) The addressing assignments will be initiated by the County;
- (b) The addresses will be established by Contractor and assigned

using the Tazewell County highway grid system, the addressing system existing in the vicinity of the new property, or a reasonable addressing system developed by the Contractor, where appropriate;

(c) The Community Development Officer, or some other officer designated by the County Board, shall accept addresses established by Contractor, and by acceptance, the County does thereby release and indemnify Contractor from any liability with regard to the addresses.

(d) The County shall have in place, and make a good faith effort to enforce, a requirement that all property owners display the correct address number at each residence or business location. It is expressly understood that it is not the responsibility of Contractor to see that addresses are posted.

(e) Contractor shall have the right to solicit business and sell addressing display units to residents of the County. It is understood, however, that the business of selling addressing display units shall be competitive with any third party wishing to market such a service.

(2) Scope of Work. The County will take and receive applications for addresses, and will provide Contractor with said applications. Contractor shall act as an independent contractor in providing the addressing services. The County shall be responsible for collecting any fees or charges for addressing services.

Contractor shall have seventeen (17) days within which to assign addresses after Contractor's receipt of a request from the County. Contractor shall not be liable for delays in utilities establishing service to property owners nor shall Contractor be liable for delays in starting construction, or the issuance of required permits.

Contractor shall provide addressing services for subdivisions, single-family dwellings, multi-family dwellings, businesses, government buildings, farm buildings and other structures under the terms of this Agreement.

(3) Compensation/Fee Schedule. The parties agree that Contractor will be compensated by the County, under this Agreement as follows:

(a) on or before March 1, 2014	\$800.00
(b) on or before June 1, 2014	\$800.00
(c) on or before September 1, 2014	\$800.00
(d) on or before December 1, 2014	\$800.00

Due to the fluctuations in the housing market and general economy since the

original agreement was made, the amount of work covered by this Agreement is difficult to forecast at the beginning of each agreement term. In order to fulfill an appropriate amount of services to Tazewell County, Contractor agrees to continue to provide site address corrections, mail address corrections, and other work pertaining to correctly locating parcels and owners in Tazewell County through the Department of Community Development, Supervisor of Assessment's Office, the Tazewell County Highway Department, as those departments deem a needed service. This additional work will be done without further cost to the County, and the additional work shall be done at the convenience of both the Contractor and the county office requesting the additional work. Contractor will not submit a mileage reimbursement request unless additional mileage beyond one (1) trip each day is made to the County offices in Pekin, Illinois.

Any additional requests by the County for additional work outside the principal scope of this agreement, other than stated above, shall be at the rate of \$40.00 per hour and mileage at the maximum IRS mileage rate.

All amounts above provided shall be paid as and for addressing services for the calendar quarter. All checks for such services shall be made payable to "Municipal Addressing Services, Inc."

(4) Obligations of County. The County shall provide to or for the use of Contractor the following:


(a) the County shall provide Contractor, at the County's sole cost and expense, access to the Tazewell County Supervisor of Assessments records, by parcel identification number, as is currently being provided to Contractor.

(b) the County shall provide to Contractor, at the County's sole cost and expense, a complete set of the most recent aerial photographs of the County for Contractor's use in providing addressing services. Such aerial photographs shall include both high flight and low flight photograph sets if available, and will be provided to Contractor in a format acceptable to Contractor which is compatible with Contractor's other equipment.

(5) Term of Agreement. This Agreement shall be in full force and effect from December 1, 2013, through November 30, 2014. Either party may terminate this Address Number(s) Assignment Services Agreement by written notice of termination given to the other party at least ninety (90) days in advance of the termination date specified in said notice.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 7, CHAPTER 1,
ZONING CODE OF TAZEVELL COUNTY**

Proposed Amendment No. 41
(Zoning Board Case No. 13-35-A)

WHEREAS, an Amendment to the Tazewell County Zoning Code hereinafter was previously referred by the TAZEVELL COUNTY LAND USE COMMITTEE to the Zoning Board of Appeals for hearing; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on said Amendment was held November 5, 2013, following due publication of said hearing in accordance with law, and the said Zoning Board of Appeals thereafter made a report to this Board recommending approval; and

WHEREAS, said report of the Zoning Board of Appeals contained the following findings of fact:

1. *The proposed amendment shall not be detrimental to the orderly development of Tazewell County.*
2. *The proposed amendment shall not be detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, morals or general welfare of Tazewell County.*

which findings of fact are hereby accepted by this Board as the reason for

approving the Amendment hereinafter authorized.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF TAZEVELL COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION I. Proposed Amendment No. 41 to the Tazewell County Zoning Code referred for hearing by the Land Use Committee to amend Title 7, Chapter 1, Zoning to read as follows:

SECTION 1.

ARTICLE 28. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATOR

7 TCC 1-28 (c) Jurisdiction, Authority and Duties.

- vi. Review all applications for permits for the construction, enlargement, *structural, alterations*, conversion, or relocation of any building or structure.

- viii. Issue building permits and certificates of compliance *occupancy*, and inspect, if necessary, the building for which the permit or certificate applies.

7 TCC 1-28 (d) Additional Duties Concerning Flood Insurance Studies.

- iii. Order a discontinuance of the illegal construction of buildings or structures below the highest known flood level *Base Flood Elevation, as determined by a Flood Insurance Study, and the Flood Protection Elevation.*
- v. *Determine damaged caused to property and structures as a result of flooding events. Maintain a current file of all damaged caused to structures as it relates to substantial damage determinations.*
- vi. *Maintain all flood related information as it relates to the Community Ratings System (CRS) and prepare required documentation for CRS Cycle visits.*

SECTION 2.

ARTICLE 31. BUILDING PERMIT

7 TCC 1-31 (c) When Permit Required.

- (7) The alteration of the interior of any *residential*, institutional, commercial, industrial, or multi-family structure;
- (10) Installation of new electrical service or equipment and repairs to or replacement of existing electrical systems of any institutional, commercial, industrial or multi-family structure;
- (11) Installation or alteration of any heating, ventilation, air conditional or other mechanical system of any institutional, commercial, industrial or multi-family structure;
- (12) Installation or alteration of any plumbing system of any institutional, commercial, industrial or multi-family structure.

7 TCC 1-31 (d) Exemptions. No building permit shall be required for the following:

- (1) Routine maintenance or repair of buildings, or structures, *or equipment* such as siding, veneering, repainting or re-roofing;
- (4) **Fences used for Agricultural purposes and operations.**
- (5) **Ornamental fencing consisting of decorative posts, lattices, arbors, trellises;**

7 TCC 1-31 (e) Application for Building Permit. An application for a building permit shall be filed in the office of the Community Development Administrator on forms prescribed by the Community Development Administrator, along with the fees for building permits, plan review and inspections as prescribed in Appendix “A” of Title 7, Chapter 5, and other pertinent information. Such application shall contain and be accompanied with the following:

- (10) All plans for commercial, industrial, multi-family and institutional shall also show:
- a. Ingress and egress;
 - b. Off-street loading;
 - c. Exterior lighting; and
 - d. Location of signage
- (11) If the permit is for a single-family or two-family dwelling, additions to dwellings, or for a residential accessory structures and additions to, three (3) full sets of building plans and specifications with square footage listed.

7 TCC 1-31 (f) Issuance of a Building Permit. A building permit shall be issued when the Community Development Administrator determines that an application for a building or structure permit conforms to the applicable regulations and standards of the ordinance, and all required permits and approvals have been obtained, and all relevant fees have been paid. ~~pursuant to 7TCC1-33(a) Fee Schedule associated with a building permit.~~

7 TCC 1-31 (g) Denial of a Building Permit. The Community Development Administrator shall deny the application for a building permit or structure if the proposed construction or use does not meet the applicable provisions by this ordinance.

7 TCC 1-31 (i) Conspicuous Posting. The building permit posting card issued by the Community Development Administrator shall be conspicuously posted by the applicant on the property for which it was obtained in the manner prescribed by the Community Development Administrator. The building permit posting card shall remain posted until such time as a permanent certificate of compliance occupancy pursuant to Article 32, Certificate of Occupancy has been issued by the Community Development Administrator.

7 TCC 1-31 (j) Changes to Approved Permits.

- (2) An amendment to a building permit which requires payment of an additional fee, either because of an increase in the size of the buildings or a change in the scope of the work, shall not be approved until the applicant has paid the additional fees and the amendment has been reviewed and approved for compliance with the County's regulations.

7 TCC 1-31 (k) Expiration of Building Permit.

- (6) There shall be a maximum of two (2) permits issued for the same construction project for a single structure. Construction not completed by the expiration of the second permit shall be considered a violation of this section and the Community Development Administrator shall issue to the applicant a Notice of Violation and Notice to Appear before the Tazewell County Hearing Officer.

7 TCC 1-31 (m) Stop Work Order. When any building or structure is being constructed, either without a building permit or in violation of a properly issued building permit, the Community Development Administrator or their designee is hereby authorized to issue a Stop Work order on the premises where the violation is taking place.

The Community Development Administrator shall assess a fee for a stop work order as set forth in Article 33, Fee Schedule as prescribed in Appendix "A" Title 7, Chapter 5.

SECTION 3.

ARTICLE 32

~~ZONING COMPLIANCE CERTIFICATE~~

CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY

7 TCC 1-32 (a) Requirement of Zoning Compliance Certificate Certificate of Occupancy. The following provisions shall apply to residential and non residential and nonresidential principal and accessory structures. No building, or structure ~~or use of land~~, shall be occupied or used until a certificate of occupancy ~~compliance~~ is issued by the Community Development Administrator after a determination that the building, or structure, ~~or use of land~~ is in accordance with the provisions of any special use permit, plat approval, building permit, and all regulations of this Ordinance. A temporary certificate of occupancy ~~compliance~~ may be issued in accordance with the provisions of this article.

7 TCC 1-32 (b) When Certificate Required.

- (1) A certificate of occupancy ~~compliance~~ shall be issued by the Community Development Administrator for either of the following after compliance with all provisions of these regulations has ~~have~~ been determined:
 - ii. Occupancy ~~and use of land~~ or change in use of a building ~~or land~~.

7 TCC 1-32 (c) Issuance of Zoning Compliance Certificate Procedures for Issuane of a Certificate of Occupancy.

- (1) ~~The When all work as described on the building permit is complete including all exterior construction, the applicant shall notify the Community Development Administrator in writing. After examination of the premise to ascertain that all work described on the building permit and all exterior work has been conducted and in compliance with the applicable regulations of this Ordinance, the Community Development Administrator shall issue the Zoning Compliance Certificate.~~
(Amendment #35—12/10)

The Community Development Administrator shall inspect the property that is the subject of a building permit, a certificate of occupancy or a temporary certificate of occupancy to determine whether the use of the property and structures comply in all other respects with the pertinent provisions of these regulations, applicable sections of the County Code, the Illinois State Environmental Barriers Act (if applicable), and the Illinois Department of Public Health Code (if applicable).

- (2) No certificate of occupancy compliance certificate shall be issued for a change-in-use until the premises have been inspected and such change is certified by the Community Development Administrator to be in compliance with all applicable regulations of the zoning district in which it is located.
- (3) ~~The Community Development Administrator shall issue the original copy of the Zoning Compliance Certificate to the applicant and shall retain a duplicate copy for his/her records.~~

If the Community Development Administrator determines, after inspection, that a structure is not in compliance with applicable standards set for in this section, the established enforcement process shall be initiated within ten (10) working days after the inspection to bring the applicant into compliance.

- (4) *If the Community Development Administrator determines, after inspection, that the structure is in compliance with applicable standards set forth in this section, and if all relevant fees have been paid, a certificate of occupancy shall be issued within ten (10) working days after the final inspection.*
- (5) *The construction authorized by a permit for new construction including additions or alterations of existing structures shall be in compliance when construction is complete and all building supplies and materials have been removed from the property. Failure to remove all materials left-over from the building's construction shall be considered a violation and the Community Development Administrator shall issue to the applicant a Notice of Violation and Notice to Appear before Tazewell County Adjudication Hearing Officer.*
- (6) *A demolition authorized by a permit for the demolition of a building or structure shall be in compliance when all remnants of the building or structure have been removed from the property. The use of the building's materials to fill in the excavated area is strictly prohibited. Failure to remove all remnants of the building or structure within the life of the permit shall be considered a violation and the Community Development Administrator shall issue to the applicant a Notice of Violation and Notice to Appear before the Tazewell County Adjudication Hearing Officer.*

7 TCC 1-32 (d) Temporary Certificate of Occupancy Compliance.

7TCC 1-32 (e) Failure to Obtain Compliance Certificate of Occupancy. Failure to obtain Compliance a Certificate of Occupancy prior to occupancy or use of a structure shall result in the issuance of a Notice of Violation and Notice to Appear to the applicant before the Tazewell County Adjudication Hearing Officer which could result in a fines of \$50.00 per day for occupancy or use of said structure. ~~There shall be a fine of \$50.00 per day for occupancy or Use of a Structure prior to obtaining a Certificate of compliance.~~

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 7,
CHAPTER 1, ZONING-CODE OF TAZEWELL COUNTY
ON PETITION OF GARY AND VICKIE GREENE**

(Zoning Board Case No. 13-36-Z)

WHEREAS, a petition has been filed with the County Clerk of Tazewell County, Illinois, By Gary and Vickie Greene for an Amendment to the Official Zoning Maps of Tazewell County to change the Zoning Classification of property from an A-1 Agriculture Preservation District to a R-R Rural Residential Zoning District; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on said application designated as Zoning Board Case No. 13-36-Z as held by the Tazewell County Zoning Board of Appeals on November 5, 2013, following due publication of notice of said hearing in accordance with law, and the said Zoning Board of Appeals thereafter made a report to the County Board recommending approval; and

WHEREAS, said report to the Zoning Board of Appeals contained the following findings of fact:

1. *The proposed amendment shall not be detrimental to the orderly development of Tazewell County.*

POSITIVE. The proposed amendment shall not be detrimental to the orderly development of Tazewell County as it is consistent with other nearby residential uses.

2. *The proposed amendment shall not be detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, morals or general welfare of Tazewell County.*

POSITIVE. At this time, the proposed zoning amendment poses no foreseeable danger or risk to the public health, safety, morals, or general welfare of Tazewell County or its residents.

3. *The request is consistent with existing uses of property within the general area of the property in question.*

POSITIVE. The request is consistent with existing uses of property within the general area of the property in question. The subject site is bounded by residentially zoned land.

4. *The request is consistent with the zoning classifications of property within the general area of the property in question.*

POSITIVE. The proposed amendment will allow and encourage single family residential development adjacent to existing single family residential homes.

5. *The suitability of the property in question for the uses permitted under the existing zoning classification.*

POSITIVE. Because of the subject property's wooded and rolling topography it is not suitable for farming operations, as allowed by right in the A-1 zoning district.

6. *The suitability of the property in question for the uses permitted under the proposed zoning classification.*

POSITIVE. The property in question is suitable for the uses permitted under the proposed zoning classification of R-R given the consistency with other nearby parcels being utilized for residential purposes.

7. *The trend of development, if any, in the general area of the property in question, including changes, if any, which may have taken place since the property in question was placed in its present zoning classification.*

POSITIVE. Per the applicants, the recent trend in the immediate area has been toward residential development, generally with higher density than what is currently being proposed.

8. *The length of time the property has been vacant as zoned, considered in the context of the land development in the area surrounding the subject property.*

9. *The proposed map amendment is within one and one half (1 ½) miles of a municipality and consistent with an adopted Comprehensive Plan.*

POSITIVE. The proposed zoning map amendment is not within 1.5 miles of a municipality with an adopted Comprehensive Plan.

10. *The relative gain to the public as compared to the hardship imposed upon the individual property owner.*

POSITIVE. The relative gain to the public should the subject site remain A-1 is negligible as compared to the hardship imposed upon the individual property owners should this rezoning request be denied.

11. *The proposed amendment is consistent with the goals, objectives, and policies of the Tazewell County Comprehensive Plan.*

POSITIVE. The proposed zoning map amendment is consistent with the goals, objectives, and policies of the Tazewell County Comprehensive Plan listed below:

- Provide sufficient land to accommodate new residents and businesses in accordance with the Comprehensive Plan.
- Locate new development contiguous to existing development to aid police and fire protection.
- Locate new residential development along local roads to facilitate efficient travel and maintain public safety.

- o Avoid leapfrog development and isolated land development to preserve contiguous tracts of productive agricultural land.
- o Locate new residential development in rural areas close to roadways to preserve contiguous tracts of farmland.
- o Minimize conflict between land uses.

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE TAZEVELL

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into on this 20th day of November, 2013 by and between the TAZEVELL COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH, hereinafter referred to as "Board of Health" and COUNTY OF TAZEVELL, hereinafter referred to as "the County".

WHEREAS, the County of Tazewell, a body politic and corporate, has authorized the establishment a County Health Department and annually approves a tax levy for the operation of the County Health Department,

WHEREAS, the Board of Health is established by state statute and authorized to manage the County Health Department,

WHEREAS, the County Health Department is currently operating in buildings located at 21306 Illinois State Route 9, Tremont, Illinois in the County of Tazewell

WHEREAS, the County and the Board of Health desire to formalize and commemorate the recognized rights, responsibilities and obligations relating to the use of property located at 21306 Illinois State Route 9, Tremont, Illinois in the County of Tazewell, (hereinafter "property")


NOW THEREFORE, the County and Board of Health mutually agree as follows:

1. The County and Board of Health hereby mutually recognize that the buildings and all real property located at 21306 Illinois State Route 9, Tremont, Illinois in the County of Tazewell is owned by and legally titled to the County of Tazewell.
2. Board of Health shall, at its own expense, have the right to make alterations or improvement on the property that Board of Health may determine necessary in the furtherance of its statutory duties.
3. Board of Health shall, at its own expense, provide for its own garbage and rubbish removal, water and sewerage services and utility services unless otherwise specified in this agreement.
4. Board of Health shall, at its own expense, be responsible for the general maintenance and upkeep of all land, buildings, structures, facilities and improvements of any kind on the property.
5. Subject to funds being allocated, the County may exercise its authority to bear the cost for the replacement of systems for heating and cooling; the replacement of roofs, the resurfacing of parking lots; the replacement of sidewalks and repair to sidewalks; the replacement and maintenance of phone systems; the replacement, repair and upgrading of technology; the replacement or repair to electrical and plumbing systems; and any repairs deemed by County to be considered major repairs. Such replacements or

repairs to the property may be paid from the appropriate budget fund as authorized by the County Board.

6. County and Board of Health agree to work cooperatively to include the property in an overall maintenance plan for County property with the intent that the property is maintained to the same standards as those applied to all County property.
7. County agrees that any consideration of replacement or repairs to the property under this provision will be prioritized as part of an overall County property maintenance plan and that any replacements or repairs to the property undertaken by the County shall be considered and prioritized the same as any other planned capital improvements for County property.
8. The Board of Health and County agree that any purchases made by either party are subject to all state and federal laws and County ordinances related to purchasing, bidding and procurement.
9. Board of Health agrees to only use the property in furtherance of its statutory purposes, in the best interests of the citizens of the County.
10. The Board of Health and County agree that each party will abide by the terms of this agreement until further notice.

**MOBILE DIGITAL MAMMOGRAM
SERVICES AGREEMENT**

This **MOBILE DIGITAL MAMMOGRAM SERVICES AGREEMENT** (the "Agreement") is made and entered into this 31st day July 2013 (the "Execution Date"), to be effective on the 1st day of August 2013 ("Effective Date"), by and between **THE METHODIST MEDICAL CENTER OF ILLINOIS**, an Illinois not for profit corporation ("MMCI"), and **TAZEWELL COUNTY EMPLOYEES ("Payor")** (each, a "Party", and together, the "Parties"), pursuant to which the MMCI shall provide the following services:

RECITALS

WHEREAS, MMCI owns and operates an acute care hospital know as "The Methodist Medical Center of Illinois" located at 221 Northeast Glen Oak, Peoria, Illinois;

WHEREAS, MMCI owns and operates a mobile mammography unit is equipped with state of the art digital imaging technology;

WHEREAS, digital mammography is a proven screening tool for breast cancer

WHEREAS, the Parties agree that by offering women the option of a mobile unit coming to their employer or other locations near their home, women can more easily set aside the time for this important screening tool; and

WHEREAS, Payor would like to use MMCI's mobile digital mammography services for the benefit of its employees.

THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the provisions contained herein and the mutual benefits to be derived herefrom, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Methodist and Payor agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. Mobile Digital Mammograms.

(a) MMCI's Department of Radiology will provide Mobile Digital Mammograms ("Mammograms") to Payor for the benefit of its employees.

(b) Results shall be forwarded directly to the employee and her provider.

2. Term and Termination.

(a) The term of this Agreement shall be one (1) year, commencing at 12:01 A.M. on the Effective Date, and ending at 11:59 P.M. on the day immediately preceding the first anniversary of the Effective Date.

(b) A Party shall have the right to immediately terminate this Agreement if the other Party is in breach of any agreement, term or provision of this Agreement applicable to it and fails to cure the breach within thirty (30) days after its receipt of written notice of the breach by the non-breaching Party.

EXECUTION

(c) Either Party may terminate this Agreement upon a thirty day (30) written notice to the other party.

(d) Upon the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement, neither Party shall have any further obligations hereunder except for obligations accruing prior to the date of the expiration or termination and obligations; promises or covenants contained herein which are expressly made to extend beyond the term.

3. Payment.

(a) The Payor shall pay to MMCI, and MMCI shall accept from the Payor, a fee of Two Hundred Four Dollars (\$204.00) as payment in full for each Mammogram performed. This payment includes both the technical and professional component of the services provided. This fee shall not cover any additional testing that may result from additional findings.

(b) MMCI shall provide monthly invoices to Payor for the Mammograms. Payment shall be due and owing from the Payor within thirty (30) calendar days after its receipt of the invoice. Overdue amounts shall be subject to an accrued interest rate of one and a half percent (1.5%) per month until paid. Payor shall reimburse MMCI all reasonable costs of collection, including, without limitation, reasonable attorney fees incurred by MMCI to collect from the Payor any overdue amounts.

4. Confidential Information. MMCI shall not, without the express written consent of patient, use or disclose the confidential patient information disclosed to it hereunder for any purpose other than its performance of this Agreement.

5. Acknowledgment of Independent Contractor Relationship. Payor acknowledges that radiologists employed by Central Illinois Radiological Associates (CIRA) will read and interpret all Mammograms facilitated by and through this Agreement. Payor further acknowledges that CIRA is an independent contractor of MMCI and not in an employer/employee relationship. As CIRA is an independent contractor, MMCI has no control over the professional services rendered by CIRA and, therefore, no agency relationship exists between MMCI and CIRA. MMCI is not liable for the acts or omissions of CIRA and Payor acknowledges that MMCI has in no way held out CIRA to be an agent of MMCI.

6. Miscellaneous.

(a) Entire Agreement. This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the Parties and supersedes all prior agreements, contracts and understandings whether written or oral between the Parties and related to the subject matter hereof.

(b) Amendments. This Agreement may be amended only by a written instrument duly executed by the Parties.

(c) Notices. All notices that are required under or prescribed by this Agreement shall be in writing, shall be addressed to the receiving Party's standard business address, and shall be delivered either by hand or sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid.

(d) Governing Law and Venue. This Agreement shall be governed by, and interpreted in accordance with, and the rights of the Parties shall be determined by, the laws of the state of

Illinois, without regard to its conflict of law principles. The Parties have executed and delivered this Agreement in Peoria, Illinois, and stipulate that if either Party files litigation to construe, interpret or enforce this Agreement, Peoria County, Illinois is the proper and appropriate venue for such litigation.

(e) **Compliance.** Each Party covenants that it will be in compliance with, and will promptly amend this Agreement to conform it to (if necessary), the Privacy Standards (45 C.F.R. Parts 160 and 164), the Standards for Electronic Transactions (45 C.F.R. Parts 160 and 163, as amended by the Administrative Simplification Act) and the Security Standards (45 C.F.R. 142) (collectively, the "Standards") promulgated or to be promulgated by the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services on and after the applicable compliance dates specified in the Standards.

(f) **Medicare Participation.** Each Party warrants that it is not currently listed by a Federal agency as excluded, debarred, or otherwise ineligible for participation in any Federal health care program. Each Party agrees that it will not employ, contract with, or otherwise use the services of any individual who it knows or should have known, after reasonable inquiry: (i) has been convicted of a criminal offense related to health care (unless the individual has been reinstated to participation in Medicare and all other Federal health care programs after being excluded because of the conviction), or (ii) is currently listed by a Federal agency as excluded, debarred, or otherwise ineligible for participation in any Federal health care program. In furtherance of this requirement, each Party agrees to make reasonable inquiry as to any prospective employee, agent, or individual considered for engagement by such Party as an independent contractor by reviewing the General Services Administration's List of Parties Excluded from Federal Programs and the HHS/OIG Cumulative Sanction Report.

TAZEWELL COUNTY
BUILDING AND PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE**

ARTICLE I. GENERAL

7TCC 5-1 (a) Scope

- (1) The County of Tazewell adopts as the Building and Property Maintenance Code, the following documents with certain insertions, deletions and changes:

International Residential Building Code 2012
International Building Code 2012
International Property Maintenance Code 2012
NFPA 70: National Electrical Code 2011 Edition
State of Illinois Plumbing Code Part 890 Illinois Administrative Code
International Mechanical Code 2012
International Fire Code 2012
Illinois Accessibility Act 1996
International Energy Conservation Code 2012

- (2) This chapter and the codes adopted herein by reference shall apply in the unincorporated areas of Tazewell County.
- (3) Private sewage disposal systems shall not be subject to any of the codes adopted herein by reference, but shall be subject to the requirements of Title 6, Chapter 1, Sub Chapter A, of the Tazewell County Code, "Sewers Disposal."
- (4) Water wells and the installation of water well pumps shall not be subject to any of the codes adopted herein by reference, but shall be subject to the requirements of Title 6, Chapter 1, Sub Chapter C of the Tazewell County Code, "Water Supply."
- (5) Where provisions under the Article 4, Property Maintenance Code are in conflict with Title 6, Chapter 1, Sub-Chapter B, Public Nuisances and Title 6, Chapter 4, Human Habitation of the Tazewell County Code the provision or requirement which is the most restrictive or which establishes the higher standard shall prevail.
- (6) Buildings and structures located in the special flood hazard area shall be designed and constructed to meet the requirements of Title 8, Chapter 4, Regulating Development in Floodplain Areas of the Tazewell County Code.
- (7) This chapter and the codes adopted herein by reference shall not apply to buildings and structures used for agricultural purposes on an operating farm including farm residences.

7TCC 5-1 (b) Authority.

This chapter is adopted pursuant to the authority granted in section 5-1063 of the Counties Code (55 ILCS 5/5-1063) and 47-5 of the Criminal Code of 1961 (720 ILCS 5/47-5).

7TCC 5-1 (c) Effective date.

This chapter and the codes adopted herein by reference shall be effective as of January 1, 2014.

7TCC 5-1 (d) Severability and repeal of existing or conflicting chapters.

- (1) **Severability.** If any section, provision or portion of this chapter or the codes adopted herein by reference are adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this chapter and the codes adopted herein by reference shall not be affected thereby.
- (2) Repeal of Existing or Conflicting Chapters: Title 5, Chapter 5 of the Tazewell County Code, entitled "Tazewell County Building and Property Maintenance Code"

7TCC 5-1 (e) Rules of construction.

- (1) The present tense includes the future tense, and vice versa.
- (2) The masculine gender includes the feminine and neuter.
- (3) The singular includes the plural and vice versa.
- (4) The words "shall," "must," and "will," are mandatory in nature, implying an obligation or duty to comply with the particular provision.
- (5) The word "may" is permissive in nature.
- (6) The word "person" includes a partnership, association, firm, trust, club, institution, company or corporation as well as the individual.
- (7) Any act authorized by these regulations to be carried out by a specific official or agency of the county is implicitly authorized to be carried out by a designee of such official or agency.
- (8) The time within which an act is to be done shall be computed by excluding the first and including the last day; if the last day is a Saturday, Sunday or a legal holiday, that day shall be excluded.
- (9) If there is any conflict between this Article I and the provisions of any code adopted herein by reference, the terms of Article I shall be controlling.

7TCC 5-1 (f) Enforcement and Penalties.

- (1) **Fine.** The violation of the terms of this chapter or any of the codes adopted herein by reference is hereby declared to be a petty offense, solely punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each offense. Each day that a violation is permitted to exist shall constitute a separate offense.

- (2) **Action by the State's Attorney's Office.** If any notice of violation is not complied with promptly, the Community Development Administrator is authorized to request the State's Attorney to institute the appropriate proceedings in the circuit court:
- i. To prevent the unlawful erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration, installation, repair, conversion, maintenance, or use of the building, structure or equipment;
 - ii. To prevent the occupancy of the building or structure or use of equipment; or
 - iii. To restrain, correct or abate the violation.
 - iv. To prosecute any violation of the property maintenance code for which a Notice to Appear was written pursuant to Subsection 3 below.
- (3) **Code Hearing Unit.** As an alternative or in addition to the remedies provided for in subsection (2) above, if any notice of violation is not complied with promptly, the Community Development Administrator is authorized to utilize the proceedings set forth in Title 1, Chapter 6, Administrative Adjudication of Ordinance Violations, of the Tazewell County Code.
- (4) **Stop Work Orders.** Whenever the Community Development Administrator finds any work regulated by this chapter or the codes adopted herein by reference is being performed in a manner contrary to the provisions of this chapter or the codes adopted herein by reference he is authorized to issue a Stop Work Order.
- i. Issuance. The stop work order shall be in writing and shall be given to the owner of the property involved, or to the owner's agent, or to the person doing the work, or posted in a conspicuous location on the property where the violation occurred. Upon issuance of a stop work order, the cited work shall immediately cease. The stop work order shall state the reason for the order, and the conditions under which the cited work will be permitted to resume.
 - ii. Fee. The Community Development Administrator shall assess a fee for the Stop Work Order as set forth in Appendix "A" of this Code.
 - iii. Unlawful continuance. Any person who shall continue any work after having been issued a stop work order, except such work as that person is directed to perform to remove a violation or unsafe condition, shall be subject to penalties as prescribed herein.
- (5) **Removal of Notice of Violation.** The removal or defacing of any notice of violation posted pursuant to section TCC 5-1 (k) herein by any person other than the Community Development Administrator or their designee is hereby declared to be a petty offense punishable by a fine not to exceed two hundred dollars (\$200.00).

7TCC 5-1 (g) Illinois Department of Public Health.

No regulation adopted herein shall be enforced if it is in conflict with any rule of the Illinois Department of Public Health.

7TCC 5-1 (h) References in codes adopted herein by reference.

- (1) Any reference to the "code official", or "building official" shall be read as the "Community Development Administrator."
- (2) Any reference to the "code official" under Article 4 Property Maintenance of this Code shall read as "Community Development Administrator" and "Tazewell County Director of Health".
- (3) Any reference to the "International Zoning Code" shall be read as the "Zoning Ordinance of the County of Tazewell, Illinois," Tazewell County Code, Title 7, Chapter 1.
- (4) Any reference to the "International Plumbing Code" shall be read as the "Illinois Plumbing Code, Part 890 Illinois Administrative Code."
- (5) Any reference to the "ICC Electrical Code" shall be read as the "NFPA 70, National Electrical Code, 2011 Edition."
- (6) Any reference to the "fire code official" shall be read as "fire protection district or their designee."
- (7) Any reference to "occupancy permit" shall be read as "certificate of occupancy".

7TCC 5-1 (i) Fees.

- (1) Fees required under this chapter and the codes adopted herein by reference are set forth in Appendix A, at the end of this chapter.
- (2) All applications submitted for approval under the codes adopted herein by reference shall be accompanied by payment of a fee as adopted by the Tazewell County Board from time to time to defray the costs incurred by the county in reviewing the application. No application shall be considered to be complete until such fee has been paid. No permit required by any of the codes adopted herein by reference shall be issued until the applicable fee has been paid.
- (3) Whenever the Community Development Administrator determines that any tests are required to determine compliance with any of the codes adopted herein by reference or determines that an expert's opinion is required to determine compliance with any said codes, the costs of such tests and fees of such experts shall be paid by the owner and/or permit applicant.

7TCC 5-1 (j) Posting of violation notices.

- (1) Whenever the Community Development Administrator determines that a violation of any of the codes adopted herein by reference exists, in addition to the

requirements of said codes, he shall cause a notice of such violation to be posted in a conspicuous place near the main entrance of the affected building.

- (2) The notice shall be at least nine (9) inches in height and fourteen (14) inches in width and at the top thereof in large letters shall state "Notice of Violation." The text of the notice shall contain a reference to the provision of the code violated and may contain such other information respecting the nature of the violation as the Community Development Administrator deems advisable.
- (3) Upon removal of the cause of the violation for which the notice is posted, the Community Development Administrator or their designee shall remove the notice.

7TCC 5-1 (k) Other County regulations and the Illinois Environmental Barriers Act.

Any permit required under this chapter and the codes adopted herein by reference shall be issued only after the Community Development Administrator determines that the work requiring a permit complies with all other applicable regulations of the county and the Illinois Environmental Barriers Act (410 ILCS 25/1 et seq. now in effect or as hereafter amended), if applicable.

**ARTICLE 2.
BUILDING CODE**

7TCC 5-2 (a) Compliance with the 2012 International Building Code required.

The 2012 International Building Code is hereby adopted by reference.

7TCC 5-2 (b) Amendments to 2012 International Building Code.

The 2012 International Building Code as adopted herein by reference is amended as provided in this section.

- (1) Section 101.1 "Title" is hereby amended to read as follows:

101.1 Title. These regulations shall be known as the Building Code of Tazewell County, hereinafter referred to as "this code."

- (10) Section 105.3.2 Time limitation of application. An application for a permit for any proposed work shall be subject to the time limitations set forth in Section 7TCC1-31(k) of the Tazewell County Zoning Code.

One set of construction documents so reviewed shall be retained by the building official. Issuance of a certificate of occupancy shall not be construed as an approval of a violation of the provisions of this code or of other County ordinances.

- (19) Section 112 "Service Utilities" is hereby deleted in its entirety.
- (20) Section 113 "Board of Appeals" is hereby deleted in its entirety and the following language is substituted in lieu thereof:

113. Board of Appeals. The Board of Appeals shall be the same as the Board of Appeals under the 2012 International Mechanical Code and shall follow the procedures and regulations under Section 109 of that code.

- (21) Section 114.2 "Notice of violation" is hereby amended to read as follows:

114.2. Notice of violation. As provided in Tazewell County Zoning Code sections 7TCC 5-1 (g) and Title 1, Chapter 6 Administrative Adjudication Of Ordinance Violations, the building official is authorized to serve a notice of violation or order on the person responsible for the erection, construction, alteration, extension, repair, moving, removal, demolition or occupancy of a building or structure in violation of the provisions of this code, or in violation of a permit or certificate issued under the provisions of this code. - (30) Section 1603.1.7 “Flood design data” is hereby deleted in its entirety.

- (32) Section 1804.4 “Grading and fill in flood hazard areas” is hereby deleted in its entirety.

- B. For manufactured homes built prior to June 15, 1976 a label certifying compliance with the Standard for Mobile Homes, NFPA 501, ANSI 119.1, in effect at the time of manufacture is required.
- C. For purposes of this Ordinance, “Manufactured Home” shall mean:

A structure, transportable in one or more sections, which, in the traveling mode, is eight body feet or more in width or forty body feet or more in length, or, when erected on site, is three hundred twenty or more square feet, and which is built on a permanent chassis and designed to be used as a dwelling with or without a permanent foundation when connected to the required utilities, and includes the plumbing, heating, air-conditioning, and electrical systems contained therein; except that such term shall include any structure

which meets all the requirements of this paragraph except the size requirements and with respect to which the manufacturer voluntarily files a certification required by the Secretary and complies with the standards established under this chapter; and except that such term shall not include any self-propelled recreational vehicle (42 U.S.C. 5402(6)).

- D. Violations of these standards shall be enforced pursuant to 24 C.F.R. Part 3282.

7TCC 5-4 (b) Amendments to 2012 International Property Maintenance Code.

The 2012 International Property Maintenance Code as adopted herein by reference is amended as provided in this section:

- (1) Section 101.1 is hereby amended to read as follows:

101.1. Title. These regulations shall be known as the Property Maintenance Code of Tazewell County, hereinafter referred to as “this code.”

- (2) Section 103.1 is hereby amended to read as follows:

103.1. General. The Tazewell County Community Development Department and Tazewell County Health Department shall be the Departments of Property Maintenance and the Community Development Administrator and the Tazewell County Director of Health shall be in charge thereof.

- (3) Section 103.2 “Appointment” is hereby deleted in its entirety.

- (4) Section 103.4 “Liability” is hereby deleted in its entirety.

- (5) Section 103.5 “Fees” is hereby deleted in its entirety.

- (6) Section 106.3 “Prosecution of violation” is hereby deleted in its entirety.

- (7) Section 106.4 “Violation penalties” is hereby amended to read as follows:

106.4 Violation penalties. Any person who shall violate a provision of this code, or fail to comply therewith, or with any of the requirements thereof, shall be subject to the penalties as set forth in Section 7TCC 5-1 (f) Enforcement and Penalties.

- (8) Section 106.5 "Abatement of violation" is hereby amended by adding the following to the last sentence:

in accordance with 7TCC 1-5 (f) Enforcement and Penalties.

- (9) Section 107.2 "Form" is hereby amended to read as follows:

107.2 Form. Such notice prescribed in Section 107.1 shall be in accordance with all of the following:

1. Be in writing.
2. Include a description of the real estate sufficient for identification.
3. Include a statement of the violation or violations and why the notice is being issued.
4. Include a correction order allowing a reasonable time to make the repairs and improvements required to bring the dwelling unit or structure into compliance with the provisions of this code.
5. Inform the property owner of the right to appeal.
6. Include a statement of the right to file a lien.

- (10) Section 107.5 "Penalties" is hereby deleted in its entirety.

- (11) Section 107.6 "Transfer of ownership" is hereby deleted in its entirety.

- (12) Section 108.2.1 Authority to disconnect service utilities is hereby deleted in its entirety.

- (13) 108.3 "Notice" is hereby amended to read as follows:

108.3 Notice. Whenever the code official has condemned a structure or equipment under the provisions of this section, notice shall be posted in a conspicuous place in or about the structure affected by such notice and served on the owner or the person or persons responsible for the structure or equipment in accordance with Section 107.3. If the notice pertains to equipment, it shall also be placed on the condemned equipment. The notice shall be in the form prescribed in Section 107.2. All notices shall also comply with 7TCC 5-1 (j) Posting of Violation Notices.

- (14) 108.5 "Prohibited occupancy" is hereby amended to read as follows:

108.5 Prohibited occupancy. Any occupied structure condemned and placarded by the code official shall be vacated as ordered by the code official. Any person who shall occupy a placarded premise or shall operate placarded equipment, and any owner or any person responsible for the premises who shall let anyone occupy a placarded premise or operate placarded equipment shall be subject to penalties as prescribed by the 7TCC 5-1 (f) Enforcement and Penalties.

- (15) Section 109.3 "Closing streets" is hereby deleted in its entirety.
- (16) 109.5 "Costs of emergency repairs" is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 109.5 Costs of emergency repairs. Costs incurred in the performance of emergency work shall be paid by the County. The State's Attorney may institute appropriate action against the owner of the premises where the unsafe structure is or was located for the recovery of such costs.
- (17) Section 110.3 "Failure to comply" is hereby deleted in its entirety and the following language is substituted in lieu thereof:
- 110.3. Failure to comply. If the owner of a premises fails to comply with a demolition order within the time prescribed, which shall not be less than 15 days' notice, the code official shall request the State's Attorney's Office to apply to the circuit court for an order of demolition pursuant to Section 5-1121 of the Counties Code (55 ILCS 5/5-1121).
- (18) Section 111 "Means of Appeal" is hereby deleted in its entirety, and the following language is substituted in lieu thereof:
111. Board of Appeals. The Board of Appeals shall be the same as the Board of Appeals under the 2012 International Mechanical code and shall follow the procedures and regulations under Section 109 of that code.
- (19) Section 202, "General Definitions". The definitions of "Strict liability offense", "Person", and "Inoperable Vehicle" are hereby deleted. The following definitions are hereby added:
- INOPERABLE MOTOR VEHICLE. Any motor vehicle from which, for a period of at least seven (7) days, the engine, wheels or other parts have been removed, or on which the engine, wheels or other parts have been altered, damaged or otherwise so treated that the vehicle is incapable of being driven under its own motor power.
- LITTER. Any discarded, used or unconsumed substance or waste. "Litter" may include, but is not limited to, any garbage, trash, refuse, debris, rubbish, glass, metal, plastic or paper containers or other packaging material, motor vehicle parts, furniture, appliances, oil, carcass of a dead animal, any nauseous or offensive matter of any kind, any object likely to injure any person, or anything else of any unsightly or unsanitary nature, which exists upon any private property within the jurisdiction of the county. This definition specifically excludes used or antiquated farm equipment.
- PERSON. Any individual, partnership, copartners, firm, company, corporation, association, joint stock company, trust, estate, or any other legal entity, or their legal representative, agent or assigns.
- (20) Section 302.8 "Motor Vehicles" is hereby deleted in its entirety.

- (21) Section 302.4 “Weeds” is hereby amended as follows:

Section 302.4 Weeds. Refer to Title 6, Chapter 1, Sub-Chapter B, 6TCC 1-12, Weeds, Plants and Grass Over Certain Height Declared a Nuisance of the Tazewell County Code.

- (22) Section 304.14 “Insect Screens” is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 304.14 Insect Screens. During the period from April 1 to November 1, every door, window and other outside opening required for ventilation of habitable rooms, food preparation areas, food service areas or any area where products to be included or utilized in food for human consumption are processed, manufactured, packaged or stored shall be supplied with approved tightly fitting screens of not less than 16 mesh per inch (16 mesh per 25 mm), and every screen door used for insect control shall have a self closing device in good working condition.

Exception: Screens shall not be required where other approved means, such as air curtains or insect repellent fans are employed.

- (23) Section 602.3 “Heat Supply” is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 602.3 Heat Supply. Every owner and operator of any building who rents, leases or lets one or more dwelling units or sleeping units, either expressed or implied, to furnish heat to the occupants thereof shall supply heat during the period from October 1 to April 1 to maintain of not less than 68°F (20° Celsius) in all habitable rooms, bathrooms, and toilet rooms.

Exceptions:

1. When the outdoor temperature is below the winter outdoor design temperature for the locality, maintenance of the minimum room temperature shall not be required provided that the heating system is operating at its full capacity. The winter outdoor design temperature for the locality shall be as indicated in Appendix D of the International Plumbing Code.
2. In areas where the average monthly temperature is above 30°F (-1°) a minimum of 65°F (18°C) shall be maintained.

The current State of Illinois Plumbing Code, Part 890 Illinois Administrative Code, is hereby adopted by reference.

ARTICLE 7 MECHANICAL CODE

7TCCC 5-7 (a) Compliance with 2012 International Mechanical Code Required.

The 2012 International Mechanical Code is hereby adopted by reference. In addition, the following Appendices to the 2012 International Mechanical Code are also adopted by reference: Appendix A – Combustion air openings and chimney connector pass-through.

7TCC 5-7 (b) Amendments to 2012 International Mechanical Code.

The 2012 International Mechanical Code as adopted herein by reference, is amended as provided in this section.

- (1) Section 101.1 is hereby amended to read as follows:

101.1 Title. These regulations shall be known as the Mechanical Code of Tazewell County, hereinafter referred to as “this Code.”

- (2) Section 103.1 is hereby deleted in its entirety and the following language is substituted in lieu thereof:

Section 103.1. General. The Community Development Department shall be the Department of Mechanical Inspection and the person in charge thereof shall be the Community Development Administrator

- (3) Section 103. 2 “Appointment” is hereby deleted in its entirety.

- (4) Section 103.4 “Liability” is hereby deleted in its entirety.

- (5) Section 106.3.3 "Time limitation of application" is hereby amended to read as follows:

106.3.3 Time limitation of application. An application for a permit for any proposed work shall be subject to the time limitations set forth in Section 7TCC1-31(k) of the Tazewell County Code.

- (6) Section 106.4.2 "Validity of permit" is hereby amended by adding:

The building official shall post notice when violations of this code or of any other ordinances, in accordance with Section 7TCC 5-1(j) Posting of Violation Notices, and may seek to prevent occupancy or use of the structure pursuant to Section 7TCC 5-1 (f) Enforcement and Penalties.

- (7) Section 106.5 "Fees" is hereby amended to read as follows:

106.5. Fees. A permit shall not be issued until the fees prescribed in Appendix "A" of this Chapter have been paid, nor shall an amendment to a permit be released until the additional fee, if any, due to an increase of the mechanical system, has been paid.

- (8) Section 106.5.1 "Work commencing before permit issuance" is hereby amended as follows:

106.5.1 Work commencing before permit issuance. Any person who commences work on a mechanical system before obtaining the necessary permits shall be subject to penalties as prescribed by Section 7TCC 5-1(f) Enforcement and Penalties in addition to the required permit fees.

- (9) Section 106.5.2 "Fee schedule" is hereby deleted in its entirety.

- (10) Section 106.5.3 "Fee refunds" is hereby deleted in its entirety.

- (11) Section 108.2 "Notice of violation" is hereby amended to read as follows:

108.2. Notice of violation. In accordance with Section 7TCC 5-1(j) Posting of Violation Notices, the code official shall serve a notice of violation or order to the person responsible for the erection, installation, alteration, extension, repair, removal or demolition of mechanical work in violation of the provisions of this code, or in violation of a detail statement or the approved construction documents thereunder, or in violation of a permit or certificate issued under the provisions of this code. Such order shall direct the discontinuance of the illegal action or condition and the abatement of the violation.

- (12) Section 108.3 "Prosecution of violation" is hereby deleted in its entirety.

- (13) Section 108.4 "Violation penalties" is hereby amended to read as follows:

108.4 Violation penalties. Persons who shall violate a provision of this code or shall fail to comply with any of the requirements thereof or who shall erect, install, alter or repair mechanical work in violation of the approved construction documents or directive of the code official, or of a permit or certificate issued under the provisions of this code shall be subject to penalties set forth in Section 7TCC 5-1(f) Enforcement and Penalties.

108.5 Stop work orders. Whenever the Community Development Administrator finds any work regulated by this code being performed in a manner that is contrary to the provisions of this code, the Administrator is authorized to issue a stop work order in accordance with 7TCC 5-1(f) Enforcement and Penalties.

- (15) Section 108.6 “Abatement of violation” is hereby deleted in its entirety.
- (16) Section 108.7.1 “Authority to condemn mechanical system” is hereby amended to read as follows:

108.7. Authority to condemn mechanical system. Whenever the code official determines that any mechanical system, or portion thereof, regulated by this code has become hazardous to life, health, property, or has become unsanitary, the code official shall order in writing that such system either be removed or restored to a safe condition. A time limit for compliance with such order shall be specified in the written notice. A person shall not use or maintain a defective mechanical system after receiving such notice.

- (17) Section 108.7.2 “Authority to order disconnection of energy sources” is hereby deleted in its entirety.
- (18) Section 108.7.3 “Connection after order to disconnect” is hereby deleted in its entirety.

Employment Agreement for Superintendent of Highways

This Agreement entered into by and between the County of Tazewell, a body politic and corporate (hereinafter referred to as "County"), and Robert K. Simmering, P.E. of 5054 East Nordic Wood Drive, Byron, IL 61016, Tazewell County Superintendent of Highways (hereinafter referred to as "Employee"), this 20th day of November, 2013.

1. **TERM.** The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of six (6) years beginning on or about January 2, 2014 unless otherwise terminated by resignation of Employee, termination by agreement of the parties, or upon removal of Employee as provided by statute. For the purposes of this Agreement, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto that the failure of Employee to abide by any term of this Agreement may justify the removal of Employee from office.

It is contemplated and agreed by the parties hereto that Employee shall be entitled to no other or further salary, compensation or benefit except as provided herein, or mutually agreed upon, with the exception of insurance benefits, Social Security benefits, and I.M.R.F. benefits as are provided to other Tazewell County employees.

2. **SALARY.** For the period January 2, 2014 through December 31, 2014 Employee shall be paid an annualized salary of \$110,000. Effective January 1, 2015 and each January 01 thereafter during the term of this Agreement, Employee salary shall be entitled to a COLA increase equal to that provided to all excluded employees, additional merit compensation is subject to an annual review and negotiation but meet an annualized salary set at a minimum of ninety-five percent (95%) of the compensation as recommended by IDOT's County Engineer Salary Program for the specific year. Said salary is to be paid in equal installments upon the same terms as other Tazewell County employees.
3. **RELOCATION ASSISTANCE.** The Employee shall receive reimbursement for relocation expenses in an amount of up to \$3,000.00. This assistance shall be limited to round trip mileage for two visits to secure housing, two nights lodging for the purpose of securing housing, moving expenses including mileage for the transportation of personal vehicles, and/or temporary housing. Receipts and mileage reimbursement forms will be required for reimbursement.
4. **VEHICLE ALLOWANCE.** For calendar year 2014 employment, the County shall provide Employee a monthly vehicle allowance of Six Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$650.00) in recognition the Employee will use his personal

vehicle in the performance of his duties under this contract while traveling in the tri-county area of Peoria, Tazewell and Woodford Counties. Travel outside the tri-county area is available for mileage reimbursement according to County Policy. Said vehicle compensation will be negotiated at a minimum on a yearly basis.

5. **GROUP MEDICAL INSURANCE.** The County shall provide Employee with employee health, hospitalization, prescription drug, dental and optical coverage under the same terms and conditions as provided to all other non-union employees.
6. **VACATION.** The Employee will immediately be credited with ten (10) days of vacation which will be available for usage immediately upon hire, and will accrue per pay period at an hourly rate equal to three (3) weeks annual vacation, to be available for usage as it is accrued. A maximum of eighty (80) hours, or ten (10) days of vacation leave may be carried forward from one calendar year to the next at the discretion of the Employee. Any vacation leave scheduled, which exceeds five (5) consecutive workdays, must be first approved by the County Board Chairman. Any vacation leave accrued under the terms hereof and remaining unused, not to exceed two hundred forty (240) hours, or thirty (30) days, at the termination of the Agreement will be paid in cash to Employee at such time in an amount equal to the number of hours of such unused vacation leave multiplied by the Employee's then current hourly rate of pay. Such hourly rate will be calculated by dividing the Employee's then current annual salary by two thousand eighty-eight (2,088) hours.
7. **SICK LEAVE.** Employee will immediately be credited with ten (10) days of sick leave which will be available for usage immediately upon hire and shall receive the same sick leave benefits provided under the Tazewell County Personnel Policy.
8. **EQUIPMENT AND PERSONNEL.** The County of Tazewell shall provide for the Tazewell County Highway Department all equipment and personnel reasonably required as determined by the Tazewell County Board. Employee recognizes that all equipment and personnel so provided are to be used solely and specifically for the performance of County business only and the same shall not be utilized by employee to perform or accomplish personal purposes.

It is recognized by Employee that all materials of any value coming into the possession of Employee in the course of his employment, whether said items or materials be of salvage value only, or otherwise, shall

of Tazewell, the same shall be forwarded to the Tazewell County Auditor together with a properly executed Tazewell County Claim voucher, which voucher shall indicate the recommended fund for payment. All such Tazewell County Claim Vouchers shall be signed and sworn to by Employee. Employee shall cooperate with the Tazewell County Auditor's Office in compilation of monthly expenditure reports.

After approval by the Tazewell County Board of each monthly expenditure report and approval of the expenditures contained therein, each check for payment shall be prepared by the Tazewell County Treasurer and sent to the Auditor for disbursement, which check shall be accompanied by a copy of the vendor's invoice. Employee shall cooperate in said process when so requested by the Tazewell County Auditor. Upon receipt of all invoices by the Tazewell County Auditor, which invoices are forwarded to him by Employee, it is contemplated and recognized by the parties hereto that the Tazewell County Auditor will undertake an invoice audit procedure including the following steps:

- (1) A determination shall be made that the claim is a legitimate claim against Tazewell County monies;
- (2) A determination shall be made as to the proper account of Tazewell County from the chart of accounts;
- (3) A determination shall be made as to whether or not each claim has been paid previously in full or in part;
- (4) A deduction shall be made of any improper taxes or other miscellaneous charges;
- (5) A determination shall be made if the claim has been properly authorized by the appropriate person delegated by law to contract for such goods or services;
- (6) A determination shall be made that there are sufficient sums in the appropriate line item to pay for such claims; and
- (7) The math and billing details shall be checked to correctness. With respect to each of the steps above stated, Employee, when so requested, shall fully cooperate with the Tazewell County Auditor in performing those functions.

15. **DUTIES OF EMPLOYEE.** It is recognized that all highways in the County of Tazewell under the County Highway system are under the direct control and supervision of the Tazewell County Board. Employee herein, subject to the general supervision of the County Board, shall perform the following functions and duties as follows:

- (a) Prepare or cause to be prepared, plans, specifications and estimates for all bridges and culverts to be built by the County, or



17. **OUTSIDE ACTIVITIES.** Employee shall not engage in teaching, counseling, or other non-County connected business without the prior approval of the County Board.




