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Proceedings of the Tazewell County Board of Tazewell County, Illinois were held in the Justice Center Community Room in the City of Pekin on Wednesday, April 27, 2016.

Board members were called to order at 6:01 p.m. By Chairman Zimmerman presiding with the following members present: Connett, Crawford, Donahue, Grimm, Graff, Harris, Hillegonds, Holford, Imig, Meisinger, Menold, Mingus, Neuhauser, Proehl, Redlingshafer, Sciortino, Sinn, Sundell, Vanderheydt and Wolfe.

Invocation was given by Chairman Zimmerman, Followed by Chairman Zimmerman leading the Pledge of Allegiance. Chairman Zimmerman asked if there was any communications from the public, after announced Joe Hranka raised his hand. Chairman Zimmerman then asked for Mr. Hranka to approach and speak. Mr. Hranka discussed his dislike for the restructure of the Administration office which would then take away job duties from the Auditor's office. Hranka explained that County Board attests that the duties are good but the change will increase costs to the county. He also stated that the change will transfer duties that should be to the elected officials. Hranka was very adamant if it was so important then why it wasn't done with the previous County Administrator as recommended. He also mentioned the electors have no say so and it will not save money. The last comment/question Hranka stated was "why were the individuals running not made aware of this prior to running in the Primary. Which office is next to have duties removed by the County Board. Thank you".

Honorable Judge Paul P. Gilfillan and Adult Chief Probation Susan Walker presented a Mental Health Presentation. Paul explained for the last 11 months with AOIC they have been working on rec. certification from the Supreme Court on Problem Solving courts. Drug Courts and Mental Health Courts. Judge Gilfillan spoke about providing assistance and oversite to put them back to the County without recidivism on offending crimes. There is no financial request from the County, funding is made from filing fees, etc. to fund

# AGREEMENT BETWEEN TAZEWELL COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL AND TAZEWELL COUNTY VETERINARY MEDICAL ASSOCIATION

THIS AGREEMENT entered into by and between Tazewell County Animal Control, a Department of the County of Tazewell, Illinois, a body politic and corporate, hereinafter referred to as "TCAC", and the Tazewell County Veterinary Medical Association, hereinafter referred to as "TCVMA", is effective the 23th day of April , 2016.

WHEREAS, TCAC administers the Tazewell Animal Control Population Control Program which provides for low cost sterilization surgeries for dog and cat owners who are eligible for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits;

WHEREAS, TCAC desires TCVMA to provide sterilization surgeries and related services at its member vetorinary clinics;

WHEREAS, the TCVMA agrees to provide sterilization surgeries for dogs and cats of eligible owners in Tazewell County;

WHEREAS, the TCVMA and its members will accept the fees for sterilization surgeries listed herein;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

TCVMA and its members will provide sterilization surgeries for dog and cat owners eligible for low cost sterilization surgeries.

"Eligible owners" shall mean a dog or cat owner who is a Tazewell County resident receiving benefits under Illinois' Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program or benefits under the Supplemental Security Income (SSI) program and who has completed an application for low cost sterilization surgeries with TCAC pursuant to the Tazewell Animal Control Population Control Program.

"Eligible dogs or cats" shall mean a dog or cat that is owned by a person who is a Tazewell County resident receiving benefits under Illinois' Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program or benefits under the Supplemental Security Incomé (SSI) program and who has completed an application for low cost sterilization surgeries with TCAC pursuant to the Tazewell Animal Control Population Control Program which dog or cat is being sterilized by TCVMA or its members.

"Sterilization surgeries" shall mean ovariohysterectomy and castration.

#### I. <u>DUTIES OF TCVMA AND ITS MEMBERS</u>

The TCVMA and its members agree to:

- 1) Perform examinations on any eligible dog or cat to determine whether the dog or cat is appropriate for a sterilization surgery.
- Administer Feline Distemper, Canine Distemper-Parvo, and/or rabies vaccinations as deemed appropriate by the treating veterinarian and based upon the age of the animal and its current vaccination status.
- Perform sterilization surgery procedures related to the sterilization surgery procedure for eligible dogs and cats.
- 4) Perform all services under this agreement in full compliance with all applicable state, federal and local laws and all applicable regulations, ordinances and requirements.

- 5) Provide all facilities, equipment, supplies, medications, licensed staff and any and all materials necessary to perform the obligations under this Agreement.
- 6) After sterilization surgery and any recovery deemed necessary is completed, release eligible dogs and cats and return them to eligible owners.
- Obtain and maintain all permits, licenses and registrations required to perform sterilization procedures and render veterinary care or operate as a veterinarian in the State of Illinois.
- Arrange payment with the eligible owner for any costs or necessary medical services rendered but not addressed by and included in this Agreement.
- 9) Promptly present any bills to be paid to TCAC.
- 10) Accept payment from TCAC at the established rates listed herein for sterilization of eligible dogs or cats.
- 11) Complete any and all forms and documentation required by TCAC in the administration of the Tazewell Animal Control Population Control Program including but not limited to documents that confirm the completion of the sterilization procedure for an eligible dog or cat.
- Return to TCAC copies of any and all forms and documentation referred to under #11.

#### II. DUTIES OF TCAC

TCAC agrees to:

- Identify owners eligible for low cost sterilization surgery services through an application process.
- 2) Maintain records identifying eligible owners and eligible dogs and cats.
- Provide TCVMA and its members with any forms or documents required to identify eligible owners and eligible dogs and cats and to confirm the completion of sterilization procedures.
- 4) Pay bills on a monthly basis for sterilization surgery services performed by TCVMA and its members on eligible dogs and cats.

#### III. INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION

The TCVMA agrees that it and any member who provides any services under this agreement shall obtain and maintain proper and adequate professional liability insurance at the member's own expense.

#### IV. FEES

The County shall pay the TCVMA the following fees as consideration for the performance of services by the TCVMA under this Agreement:

Fee schedule:	Cat castration	\$40
	Cat ovariohysterectomy	\$50
	Dog castration	\$60
	Dog ovariohysterectomy	\$70

These fees shall be paid on a monthly basis after services are rendered. TCAC and the County of Tazewell shall not pay any fees of any kind other than those listed above.

This fee schedule shall pertain to routine sterilization surgeries on non-pregnant, non-cryptorchid, non-obese, healthy eligible dogs and cats. If the dog or cat presented for sterilization does not meet these criteria, the member veterinarian shall contact the eligible owner to discuss additional fees to be paid.

The TCVMA member veterinarian shall collect and retain a separate \$15 co-pay from the cligible owner. This fee will be reserved by the veterinarian clinic performing the surgery.

#### V. TERMINATION

This Agreement may be terminated by TCVMA upon providing sixty (60) days written notice to TCAC and the County of Tazewell, unless TCAC and the County of Tazewell agree in writing to an earlier termination. TCAC and the County of Tazewell may terminate this contract upon providing sixty (60) days for any reason with written notice. In the event of termination, each party shall perform its obligations under the Agreement up to the effective date of termination. After the effective date of termination, the parties shall be discharged of any further obligation under this Agreement.

#### VI. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

The parties hereby agree that the TCVMA is an independent contractor and not an employee of TCAC or the County of Tazewell and that nothing contained in this Agreement shall constitute or designate the TCVMA or any of its employees, agents or contractors as employees of the TCAC or County of Tazewell.

#### VII. NOTICES

All notices required or permitted hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly delivered hereunder if mailed by first class mail, postage pre-paid, to the respective parties at the address as follows:

#### VIII. MODIFICATION

No change or modification of the Agreement shall be valid or enforceable unless the same shall be in writing signed by both parties.

#### £X. ASSIGNMENT

It is the specific intent and understanding between the parties that this Agreement is for the sterilization surgeries of animals by the TCVMA. Any attempt by the TCVMA to assign the services to be rendered hereunder, without specific written consent of TCAC and the County of Tazewell shall be considered to be and shall constitute notice of termination pursuant to this Agreement.

#### X. LENGTH OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall commence on April 28, 2016 and expire on . This Agreement may be extended on a month-to-month basis without objection of the parties to the Agreement.

#### XI. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

1. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. No changes or modification of the Agreement shall be valid unless the same is in writing and signed by the parties. This Agreement supersedes all previous Agreements between TCAC and the TCVMA related to the sterifization of eligible animals of eligible owners as defined on page 1 of the Agreement."

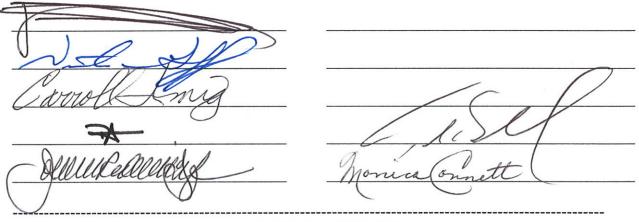

#### State and Local Government Records Management Programs

The Records Management Section of the Illinois State Archives is responsible for assisting state and local government agencies with the disposal of records. In Illinois, no public record may be disposed of without the approval of the appropriate records commission.

The Illinois Local Records Act prohibits a public entity from destroying public records without first receiving approval from the Local Records Commission. The Local Records Act defines a public record as "any book, paper, map, photograph, digitized electronic material, or other official documentary material, regardless of physical form or characteristics, made, produced, executed or received by any agency or officer pursuant to law or in connection with the transaction of public business and preserved or appropriate for preservation by such agency or officer, or any successor thereof, as evidence of the organization, function, policies, decisions, procedures, or other activities thereof, or because of the informational data contained therein." 50 ILCS 205/2. A public record may take the form of an electronic record, including but not limited to, emails (and/or attachments thereto), text messages or other electronic data. In order to ensure compliance with the Local Records Act, employees are prohibited from altering, destroying or deleting public records unless and until appropriate approval has been received from the Local Records Commission.

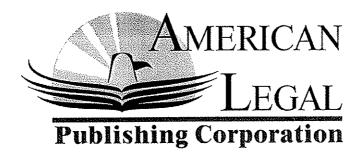

#### CODIFICATION AGREEMENT

September 23, 2015

Tazewell County, in the State of Illinois ("County"), and American Legal Publishing Corporation ("Publisher"), an Ohio corporation, agree as follows:

#### I. THE PUBLISHER SHALL:

- (1) Examine any prior code and all ordinances provided by the County and determine which materials are to be codified.
- (2) Utilize its staff of attorneys to review all materials to be codified for conformity and conflict with existing state statutes and federal law, as well as other ordinances and resolutions. Such conflicts will be brought to the attention of the State's Attorney in a written report.
- (3) Suggest new provisions which the County should consider including in the new Code, and delete old provisions which are no longer necessary or which might be improper or unlawful.
- (4) Classify all ordinances and resolutions which are of a general and permanent nature into titles, chapters, and sections, according to subject matter.
- (5) Make changes to effect uniformity of style and to correct typographical and spelling errors, grammar, and usage. Substantive changes shall not be made in the wording of the ordinances. Suggestions for additions or changes in the ordinances will be submitted to the State's Attorney.
- (6) Prepare:
  - (a) Title, chapter, and section headings.
  - (b) A table of contents and sectional analysis for each chapter.
  - (c) A legislative history for each section, citing the ordinance number and date of passage, as indicated on copies of ordinances supplied to the Publisher.
  - (d) Statutory cross-references to sections of the state statutes and to other pertinent parts of the Code where applicable. These references shall appear at the end of the section to which they apply.
  - (c) Tables of Special Ordinances listing chronologically those ordinances in certain subject areas that the County finds to be pertinent.
  - (f) Parallel Reference Tables showing:
    - 1. The disposition of ordinances (in numeric sequence) included in the codification (Ordinance to Code).
    - 2. A listing of code sections based on state statutes (Statute to Code).

- (g) An index (which will be created after the first draft of the Code is submitted).
- (7) Provide the County a consultation service, for:
  - (a) Updating ordinances in conflict with state and federal statutes;
  - (b) Providing model ordinances when requested.
- (8) Deliver to the County, within 6 months from receipt of the materials deemed necessary by the Publisher to begin the codification (ordinances and new code questionnaire), one copy of a draft of the Code for the Municipality's examination.
- (9) If necessary, hold a conference to make final corrections, additions, and deletions to the Code. The County will be billed for the travel expenses of the American Legal staff attorney. The County may present changes to pages of the draft at the conference. After the final conference, no additional changes are to be made. Any further changes, additions, or deletions shall be made in the future supplements to the Code in accordance with IV(3) of this Agreement. When the draft, and any changes thereto made by the County, is returned to the Publisher, such return of the draft shall be deemed final authorization by County to publish the Code as returned. If additional conferences are requested by the County which require the travel of a member of the staff of Publisher, then the County shall be advised what the additional cost, if any, for such conference will be.
- (10) Deliver to the Municipality, within 3 months of receipt of the corrected draft, up to 25 printed copies of the Code meeting the following specifications::
  - (a) Type to be single or dual column, at the option of the County
  - (b) Page size to be 81/2" x 11"
  - (c) Printed on high quality paper
  - (d) All copies to be in hard-covered, 3-ring or post-type, loose leaf binders. All binders shall have the County's name stamped in gold and shall contain divider tabs.
- (11) Provide a sample adopting ordinance to the County.

#### II. THE COUNTY SHALL:

- (1) Provide clear copies of all materials necessary to perform the codification, including an up to date copy of any previously published code of ordinances.
- (2) After receipt of the draft of the Code and legal report described in paragraph I (2), have 60 days to review the draft and report and to return to the Publisher its comments about the draft and its answers to the legal report. In the alternative, if the County opts for the legal conference described in paragraph I (9), it must contact the Publisher within 60 days to set up a meeting date. The meeting, itself, need not occur within the same 60 day period. If the County fails to either return its comments and answers to the legal report within 60 days or, if applicable, to set up a meeting date, the County may request that the Publisher extend the deadline in writing. The Publisher may adjust the contract price to cover any increased costs due to the County's delay.
- (3) Agree that any ordinances adopted after the time the manuscript is originally due back to the Publisher under the provisions of (2) above shall be included at the Publishers' supplement rates at the time of the inclusion of these ordinances into the code. The Publisher agrees to include in the final version of the Code all ordinances adopted by the County up to this date.

The prices above are for a five-year period and cannot be changed except for adjustments in the second, third, fourth, and fifth years of this agreement to reflect any decrease or increase in the United States Consumer Price Index calculable from the month of delivery of the Code.

(c) Upon completion of the five-year period, this agreement shall automatically renew itself from year to year except that either party may alter or cancel the terms of this agreement at any time upon ninety days written notice.

Buyer's Baseline Monthly Quantity set forth below shall be included in the Contract Quantity for the purposes of calculating any termination payments owed pursuant to the Agreement.

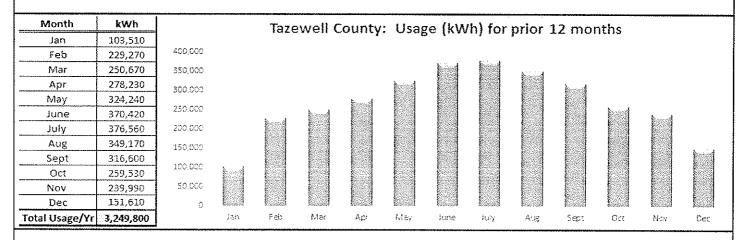

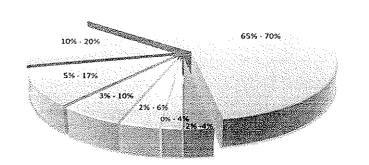

#### 6 TCC 9-1 DEFINITIONS

Closed Loop Well – means a sealed, watertight loop of buried pipe outside of a building foundation, intended to recirculate a liquid solution through a heat exchanger but is limited to the construction of the borehole, piping in the bore hole, heat exchange fluid, and the grouting of the bore hole and does not include the piping and appurtenances used in any other capacity. This includes but is not limited to vertical loop, horizontal loop and body of water loop systems. "Closed loop well" does not include any horizontal closed loop well systems where grouting is not necessary by law or standard industry practice.

<u>Closed Loop Well Contractor</u> – any person who installs closed loop wells for another person. "Closed loop well contractor" does not include the employee of a closed loop contractor.

Department-Tazewell County Health Department

<u>Food grade propylene glycol</u> – a coolant added to a closed loop well system which will allow the reduction of setbacks between the closed loop well system and a water well. The product container shall be labeled "Propylene Glycol USP" or equivalent. Any product not containing the letters "USP" will not be acceptable for this use, unless vendor documentation is produced to demonstrate equivalency.

Horizontal Closed Loop Well Systems means any open cut excavation where a watertight loop of pipe is buried outside of a building foundation that is intended to re-circulate a liquid solution through a heat exchanger.

Thermal Grout an Illinois Department of Public Health approved grout specifically developed to enhance the heat transfer in a closed loop well. The Illinois Department of Public Health will maintain a list of approved closed loop well grouts on its website.

#### 6 TCC 9-2 ADOPTION BY REFERENCE

This ordinance shall adopt by reference and shall be interpreted and enforced in accordance with provisions set forth in the current, unabridged form of the State of Illinois, Department of Public Health, "Illinois Water Well Construction Code" found at 415 Illinois Compiled Statutes 30/1 et seq., the "Water Well Construction Code" found at 77 Ill. Adm. Code 920, the "Illinois Water Well Pump Installation Code" found at 415 Illinois Compiled Statutes 35/1 et seq., the "Water Well Pump Installation Code" found at 77 Ill Adm. Code 925 and any subsequent amendments or revisions thereto.

## 6 TCC 9-3 <u>INSPECTION REQUIREMENT</u>

A closed loop well system shall not be placed into operation until the closed loop well system has been inspected by the Department to verify compliance with this Ordinance and until written approval has been issued by the Department.

#### 6 TCC 9-4 EXEMPTION

Closed Loop Well systems installed within the corporate limits of a municipality shall be exempt from the inspection requirement of this ordinance provided the municipality has a closed loop well system inspection process in place.

#### 6 TCC 9-5 SET BACK DISTANCES

All closed loop well systems must meet the minimum location requirements as set forth in the Illinois Department of Public Health Water Well Construction Code Section 920.180 subject to penalties as set forth in Section 6 TCC-13. If any of location requirements cannot be met, a variance may be applied for in accordance with Section 920.200h) of the Illinois Department of Public Health Water Well Construction Code and/or Section 6 TCC 9-9 of this ordinance.

## 6 TCC 9-6 APPLICATION FOR PERMIT

No closed loop well system shall be constructed or modified in Tazewell County, except in accordance with these regulations, and it shall be unlawful to proceed with the construction or modification or sealing of a closed loop well system without first obtaining a permit from the Department.

Application for Permit to construct, modify or seal a closed loop well system shall be in writing and on such forms provided by the Department. The closed loop well system contractor shall sign every permit application.

- (A) The application to construct or modify a closed loop well system shall be accompanied by a plan and drawing of the proposed construction or modification showing the lot size and location of property lines and distances from closed loop well construction to the location of all existing structures, wells, septic tanks, seepage fields, secondary sewage treatment units, cesspools, privies, sewers, lakes, ponds, or streams on the applicant's property and on neighboring properties, if they are within 200 feet of the proposed closed loop well system(s).
- (B) The application shall include a borehole layout. The borehole layout shall include borehole depth, grouting material, placement procedure and diameter of the heat exchange equipment that is to be grouted into the borehole. The application shall identify the registered closed loop well contractor.
- (C) The application shall identify the type of liquid that will be pumped through the closed loop piping if necessary to determine reduced setbacks.
- (D) Prior to the approval of the permit application, the Board of Health, at its discretion, may require additional information. The Department shall have the authority, subject to constitutional limitations, to enter at reasonable times upon private or public property, by its representatives after identification, for the purpose of inspecting and investigating conditions relating to the administration and enforcement of this ordinance and the

Illinois Water Well Construction Code and/or inspect the property and neighboring properties.

(E) After an application to construct a closed loop well system has been reviewed and approved, a notice to proceed shall be issued to the registered closed loop well contractor. After the application is approved and issued, no modifications shall be made without reapplying to the Department. No construction of a closed loop well system shall commence prior to approval of the application by the Department.

#### 6 TCC 9-7 PERMIT FEE

Each application to construct or modify a closed loop well system shall be accompanied by a fee payable to the Department of \$100 for the first 10 closed loop well boreholes drilled and \$10 for each additional borehole drilled. Each application for the sealing of the closed loop well system shall be accompanied by a fee payable to the Department of \$100. This fee shall not be refundable in the event that an individual decides not to construct, modify or seal the closed loop well system. A permit shall be void within one year after date of issuance.

# 6 TCC 9-8 REGISTRATION OF CLOSED LOOP WELL SYSTEM CONTRACTORS

- (a) No person shall install a closed loop well system unless that person has registered with the Illinois Department of Public Health as a Closed Loop Well Contractor.
- (b) All persons who construct closed loop well systems in Tazewell County shall be registered annually with the Board of Health. A registration fee of \$50.00 shall accompany the registration application. The registration shall expire on December 31<sup>st</sup> of the year of issue. The registration requirement shall not apply to a person who constructs a closed loop well system on land which is owned or leased by him and is used by him for farming purposes or as his place of abode.

## 6 TCC 9-9 NOTIFICATIONS

Any closed loop well contractor who constructs, modifies or seals a closed loop well must notify the Tazewell County Health Department by telephone or in writing at least 48 hours prior to the commencement of the work. Further notification may be requested by the Department as they deem necessary to assure proper construction practices and methods, e.g., installation of heat exchange equipment in the borehole, grouting of the borehole and setback distances. Information to be provided to the Tazewell County Health Department includes: date drilling/excavating started, name of closed loop well

contractor, phone number of closed loop well contractor, and permit number of closed loop well system.

# 6 TCC 9-10 USE OF FOOD GRADE PROPYLENE GLYCOL AS COOLANT

If food grade propylene glycol is used as a coolant, a closed loop well may be located within 25 feet of a water well. The installation of the coolant shall be witnessed by a representative of the Tazewell County Health Department. Annually, the property owner shall certify in writing on the form prescribed by the Board of Health that the food grade propylene glycol coolant was not modified in any way other than to add replacement food grade propylene glycol coolant. In the case of the sale of the property, the seller shall so certify prior to the sale of the property.

#### 6 TCC 9-11 CASING

When permanent casing is installed, the casing and grouting shall meet the requirements for water well casing in the Illinois Water Well Construction Code. The outside of the casing shall be grouted prior to the grouting of the heat exchange equipment on the inside of the casing.

#### 6 TCC 9-12 GROUTING

Each closed loop well shall be grouted as required in Section 920.180 And 920 Table C of the Illinois Water Well Construction Code. Each closed loop well shall be grouted in the same day as the closed loop well is constructed.

#### 6 TCC 9-13 SUPERSESSION BY STATE LAW

Should any of the provisions of this ordinance conflict with a closed loop well system state law or code passed subsequent to this ordinance, the state law or code shall take precedence over this ordinance.

## 6 TCC 9-14 PENALTIES

The following penalties shall apply to persons who construct closed loop well systems upon violation of the following requirements:

Failure to meet location requirements as required by Section 920.180 of the Illinois Department of Public Health Water Well Construction Code (variance not obtained) - \$250.00.

Failure to submit an application to construct, modify or seal a closed loop well system - \$250.00.

Failure to inform the Tazewell County Health Department of the availability of a closed loop well system installation for inspection, with the result that the closed loop well holes are covered without being inspected - \$250.00.

Failure to register with the Board of Health - \$250.00.

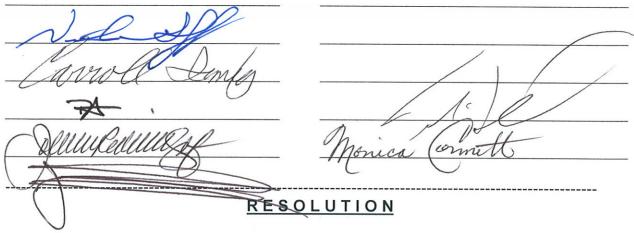

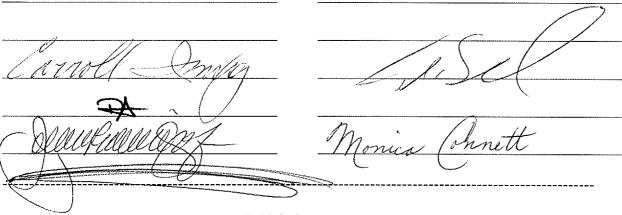
