STEVE DENNIS - PEKIN

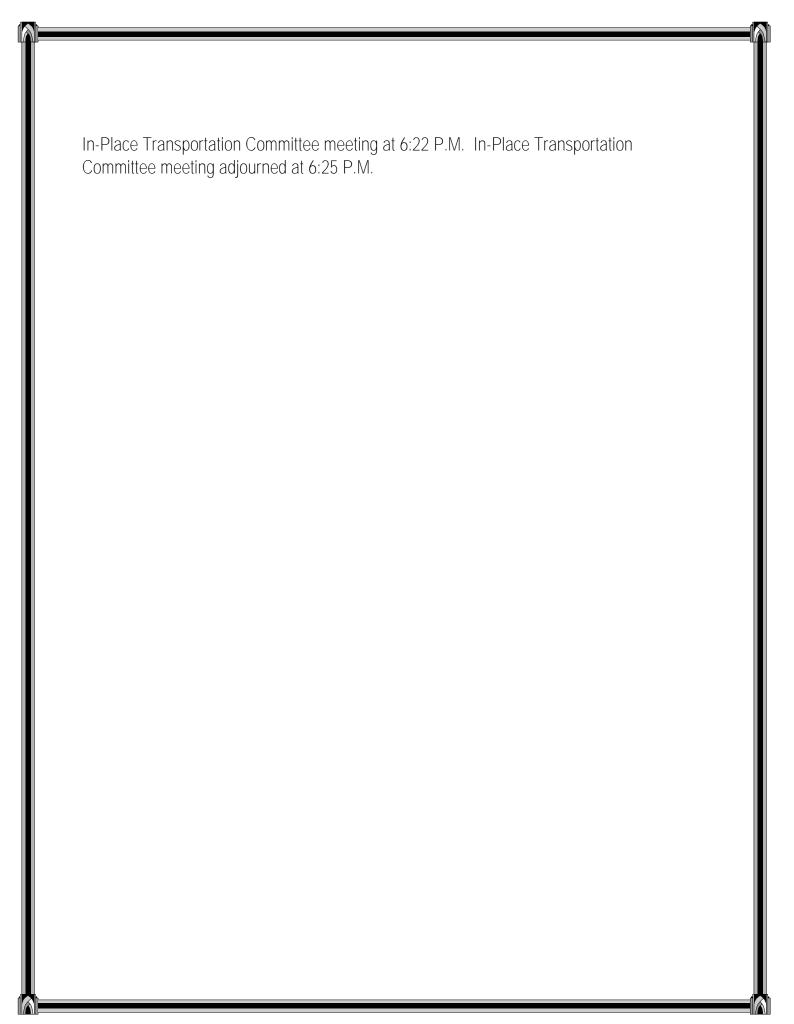
Communications: Steve Dennis, Resident of Pekin talked of his support of the resolution to not allow override of the 2nd amendment in Springfield.

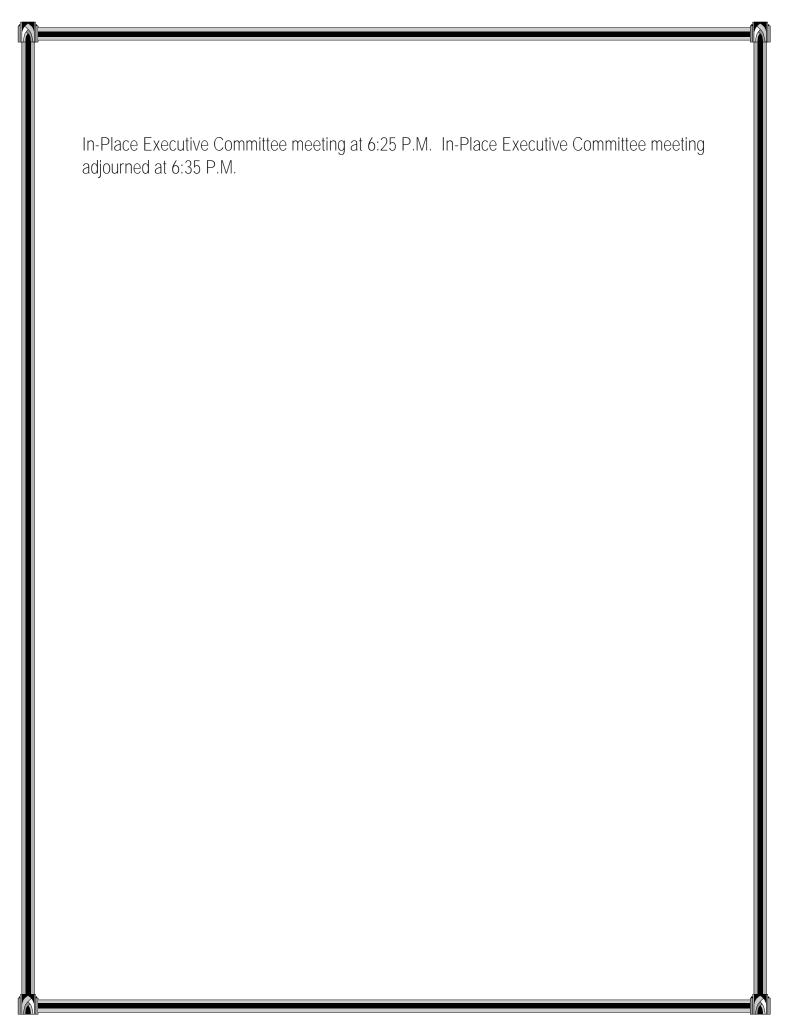

WHEREAS, Luke Coriell and his mother Kathleen Coriell (the Coriell's) are the owners of P.I.N. #16-16-34-200-002 & 024; a total of approximately 10.63 combined acres located in part of the East Half of the East Half of the Northeast Quarter of Section 34, Township 23 North, Range 5 West of the Third Principal Meridian, Sand Prairie Township, Tazewell County, Illinois; and

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, P.I.N. #16-16-34-200-024 contains an existing dwelling and out buildings which is currently rental property. However, the individual renting the home wishes to purchase the home and approximately 2.7 acres;

WHEREAS, the Coriell's will retain ownership of the remaining acreage containing approximately 7.9 acres which is utilized as farmland, however the 7.9 acres will not have frontage on a public road but is proposed to be accessed via a private ingress and egress easement thru the 2.7 acres to be sold; and

WHEREAS, said easement will be approximately 930' in length and 20' in width; and

WHEREAS, the Land Use Committee of the Tazewell County Board has made the following findings of fact:

- 1. The grant of the waiver to allow access via a private ingress and egress easement to the 7.9 acres will not have a negative effect the purpose of the Comprehensive Plan.
- 2. There is not a need for a public road at this location to access the farm ground.

- 3. The Zoning Board of Appeals approved Case No. 18-22-V on June 5, 2018 for a Variance waive the requirements of 7TCC1-7(f) to allow the sale of the existing farmstead containing approximately 2.7 acres to have 178' of frontage along a public roadway, which is 22' less than allowed; and to waive 7TCC1-7(f) to allow a new zoning lot of record containing approximately 7.9 acres to be created containing farmland which will not have road frontage on a public road, but will have access via a private easement in an A-1 Agriculture Preservation District.
- 4. Allowing the private easement is the minimum adjustment necessary that will allow for the reasonable use of the land as there are no other alternatives for the Coriell's to obtain access.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tazewell County Board grants the prayer of the petitioner for access to the 7.9 acres via a private ingress and egress easement with the following conditions:

- 1. Said easement shall be shown and described on the tract survey presented to the County Plat Officer for approval and recorded in the Office of the Tazewell County Recorder of Deeds, a well as, being described in a deed for the parcel.
- 2. Said easement shall run with the land.
- 3. There shall be no further division of 7.9 acres unless all requirements of the Tazewell County Zoning and Subdivision Code are met.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Plat Officer is directed to approve a plat prepared in accordance with this resolution.

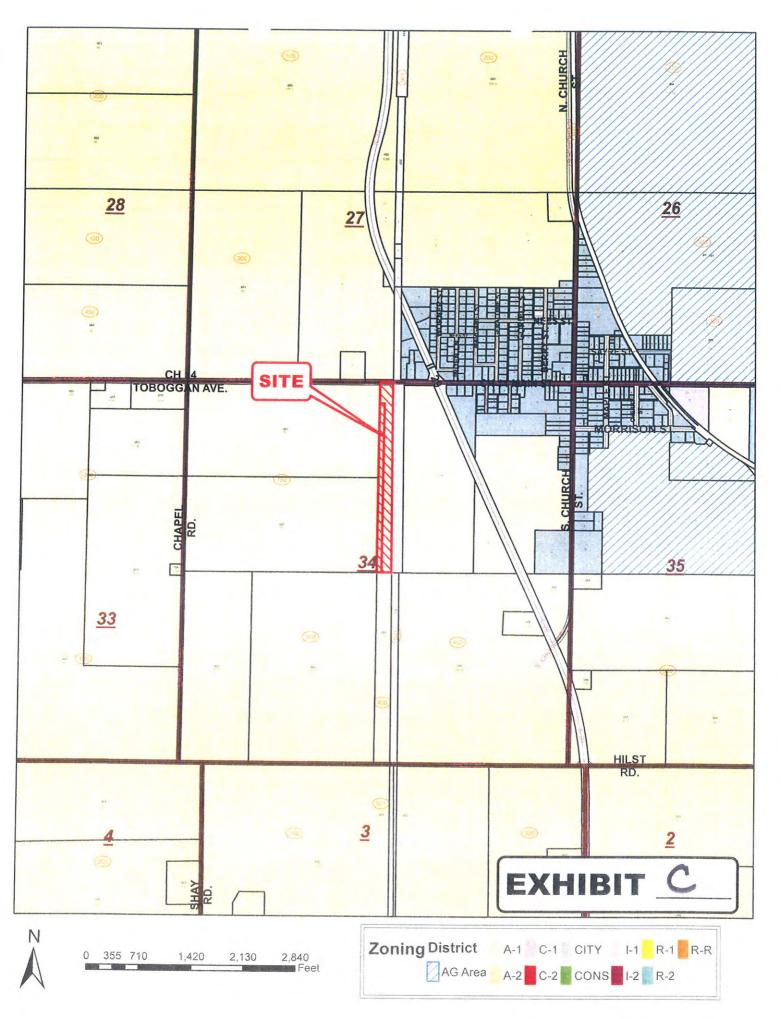
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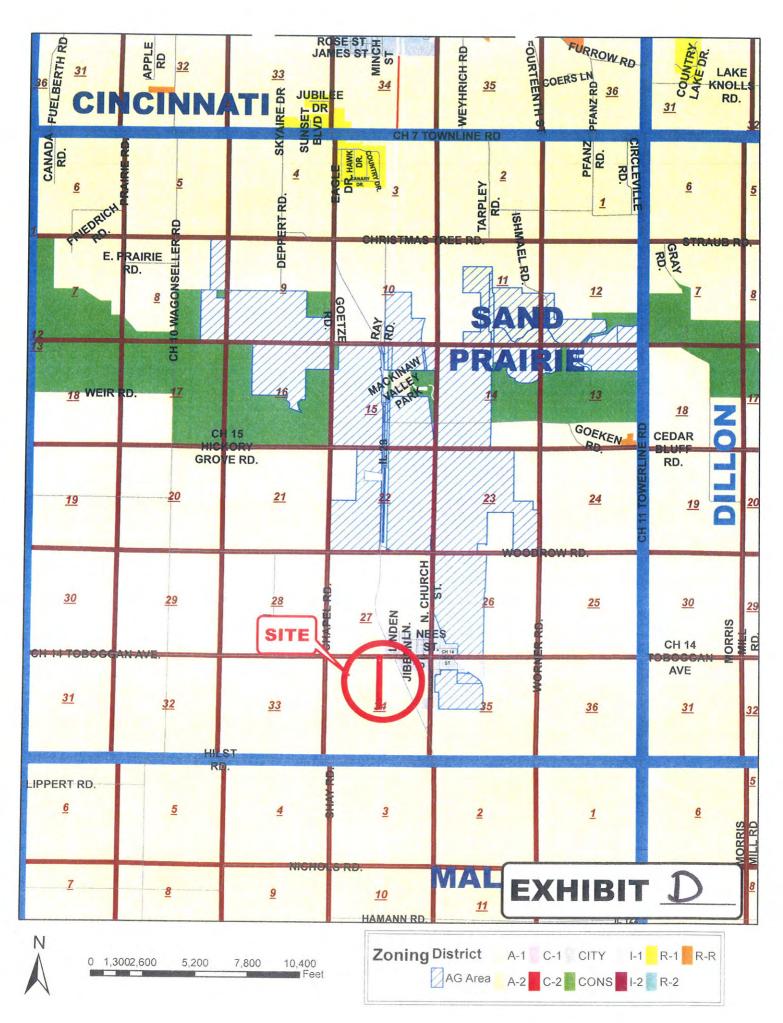


SITE PLAN

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RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, codified as amended, 820 ILCS 130/1 et seq. (1993), formerly Ill. Rev. Stat., Ch. 48, par. 39s-1 et seq. and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the County Board of the County of Tazewell investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of Tazewell County employed in performing construction of public works, for said Tazewell County.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF TAZEWELL COUNTY:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the County Board is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Tazewell County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June, 2001, a copy of the determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. As required by said Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois shall supersede the Department's June determination and apply to any and all public works construction undertaken by the County Board. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the County Board to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3: The Tazewell County Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wages. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 4: The Tazewell County Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The Tazewell County Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Resolution with <u>both</u> the Secretary of State Index Division and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6: The Tazewell County Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a copy of this Resolution, and such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of this public body.

AGREEMENT FOR DISPATCH SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between TAZEWELL COUNTY CONSOLIDATED COMMUNICATIONS, an intergovernmental agency created pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq., (hereinafter called "TC3") and TAZEWELL COUNTY (hereinafter called "USER").

WHEREAS, as a result of State law requiring the consolidation of the four (4) public safety answering points ("PSAPs") located in Tazewell County down to two (2) PSAPs, an intergovernmental agency known as TC³ was created pursuant to an Intergovernmental Agreement by and between the City of Pekin, the City of East Peoria, the City of Washington, the Village of Morton, Tazewell County, the Tazewell County Sheriff, and the Tazewell County Emergency Telephone System Board, for the purpose of overseeing the operations of the two PSAPs, which such two PSAPs shall provide 9-1-1 telephone call taking, dispatch, and related services to public safety agencies located in Tazewell County; and

WHEREAS, it is recognized by and between the parties that quick access to law enforcement information is of benefit to the public at large without regard to municipal boundaries and is of benefit to multiple governmental efforts in their pursuit to prevent and detect crime, arrest and prosecute offenders, and protect persons and property; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Agreement is to make available to USER, the services and capabilities of TC³ at a reasonable cost to USER; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto, pursuant to the authority vested in them by Article 7, Section 10 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1 et seq.), as it now or may hereinafter be amended, are authorized to enter into this Agreement.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. DUTY AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF TC³. TC³ will furnish to USER, through TAZEWELL COUNTY COURT SERVICES access to: (1) All computerized law enforcement information available to TC³ through its system from LEADS, NCIC, NLETS, the Illinois Secretary of State, and other interfaced systems; (2) the ability to transmit and receive from other terminals within LEADS and the TC³ system bona fide law enforcement messages; and (3) police dispatch and telephone answering service twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week.
- **2. DISPATCH SERVICES.** The services provided by TC³ shall be collectively referred to herein as "Dispatch Services."
- 3. RESPONSIBILITIES OF USER. In consideration of the above stated services rendered from TC³ to USER, the USER through TAZEWELL COUNTY COURT SERVICES hereby agrees to strictly comply with all rules, regulations and policies of TC³ as they pertain to communication functions

The **USER** through **TAZEWELL COUNTY COURT SERVICES** shall further strictly comply with all statutes, rules, regulations, policies and contractual obligations made,

including, but not limited to LEADS, NCIC regulations, criminal history record information, criminal justice agreements, and all required agreements and/or licensing requirements of the United States Government, government of the State of Illinois, or any other User or subdivision thereof which is required to be maintained by the USER for eligibility to receive services and/or information covered by this Agreement and shall provide TC³ with current copies of the same.

With respect to any employee of **TAZEWELL COUNTY COURT SERVICES** who is authorized access to or information from the services provided for by this Agreement, the **USER** shall make known and available to said individual all statutes, rules, regulations, policies and contractual obligations referred to above.

4. SECURITY TO BE MAINTAINED BY USER. The USER and TAZEWELL COUNTY COURT SERVICES shall maintain communications equipment in a secured environment to ensure that no unauthorized person has access to the same. The USER will insure that no person shall be permitted access to or use of the communications equipment except sworn law enforcement personnel and other employees authorized to use said equipment.

The USER and TAZEWELL COUNTY COURT SERVICES will insure that no person shall be permitted access to or use of any USER's or TC3's communications equipment except full time law enforcement officers and other employees authorized to receive law enforcement information. All personnel authorized access to or use of any law enforcement information shall be paid employees of the USER or TC3 and no person, including the employees of any other agencies or divisions within the same government of the USER shall be authorized access to or use of such information.

The USER and TAZEWELL COUNTY COURT SERVICES hereby represent and warrant to TC³ that the USER and TAZEWELL COUNTY COURT SERVICES have the authority to discipline any employee of the USER who violates or attempts to violate this Agreement or the laws, rules, regulations, policies, and other contractual obligations incorporated herein by reference.

With respect to individuals who would be subject to disciplinary action before the police and fire commission, the **USER** represents and warrants that the **USER** will make every effort to obtain appropriate disciplinary sanctions against any police or fire officer who violates or attempts to violate this agreement or the laws, rules, regulations, policies and other contractual obligations incorporated herein by reference.

In the event any employee of the **USER** violates or attempts to violate this Agreement or the laws, rules, regulations, policies and other contractual obligations incorporated herein, and is not appropriately disciplined, TC³, may, at its option, consider such action to be a breach of this Agreement and suspend the furnishing of records, information and other services in accordance with this Agreement.

5. RESTRICTIONS ON USE OF RECORDS DATA: In recognition of the fact that TC³ records and files contain information of and include police reports contemporary with the events reported therein and without the opportunity for screening and verification that is

available with ordinary criminal history records information, the **USER** hereby warrants and agrees that the **USER** and any of its employees will not:

- A. Search, inquire, retrieve or copy TC³ records or information except in connection with a specific criminal investigation, or for background investigation for government licenses, or government employment;
- B. Disclose any TC³ records or information to press or non-police officials, citizens, witnesses, victims, insurance companies, private investigators, public persons or governmental employees, or to police officers not actively participating in the investigation for which the records information is received;
- C. Take any action adverse to any individual interest based either wholly or in part on the TC³ record information without verifying that such information is accurate, complete and current;
- D. Use nor disseminate any information which is shown to be inaccurate, incomplete or outdated; and
- E. Fail to train its employees in the nature of records information and require and enforce independent investigation and verification before identifying person as those shown in records files.

The **USER** and **TAZEWELL COUNTY COURT SERVICES** shall be solely and singularly responsible for the accuracy, completeness and currentness of all information it transmits, or is transmitted on its behalf, for processing and for the resultant output thereof to other users or inquirers and shall be responsible for necessary purging of errors and outdated or nonusable information.

All dissemination of information received from TC³ records or from State of Illinois files shall be logged in a form approved by TC³ and maintained for a period of not less than three years.

6. SUSPENSION OF RECORD INFORMATION SERVICE. It is hereby agreed by and between the parties that TC³ may suspend the furnishing of records information upon receiving notification from the USER, or any board or agency charged with the supervision of the collection, storage, or dissemination of law enforcement information, including, but not limited to Illinois Department of Law Enforcement, Federal Bureau of Investigation, Law Enforcement Assistance Administration, Illinois Secretary of State, or the LEADS policy board, that the USER is in violation of any law, rule, regulation, or contractual obligation with said board or agency concerning the collection, common storage, use or dissemination of law enforcement information and has been suspended by the board or agency. The USER shall promptly notify TC³ of any such violation. TC³ will resume furnishing records information upon notification that such suspension has been lifted.

TC³ may also immediately suspend any and all services upon finding that any of the terms and conditions of this contract have not been fulfilled, including breaches of the privacy

and security provisions which may be discovered or complained of by citizens. Any such suspension shall be in accordance with Section 8 of this Agreement.

7. PAYMENT. The USER shall pay to TC3 an "Annual Payment Amount" for the Dispatch Services provided pursuant to this Agreement. The "Initial Annual Payment Amount" made to TC³ from **USER** shall be \$5,709.00. Except with regard to the Initial Annual Payment Amount (which is based upon dispatch activities in 2016), the Annual Payment Amount shall be set by the TC3 Governance Board and shall reflect a proportion of the TC3 budget based upon an activity-based assessment determined by the number of dispatch activities attributed to the USER in the preceding calendar year, as a percentage of the total number of dispatch activities of all public safety agencies in Tazewell County contracting with TC3 ("Funding Formula"). The TC³ Governance Board shall adopt an annual budget and determine the USER's Annual Payment Amount based upon the Funding Formula by March 1st of each year. Copies of the adopted budget shall be made available to USER in accordance with the Bylaws of TC3, as amended from time to time. Written notice of USER's Annual Payment Amount shall be sent to USER by April 1st of each year. Except with regard to the Initial Annual Payment Amount, invoices for USER's Annual Payment Amount, as determined by the Funding Formula, shall be sent to the USER no later than May 1st of each year and on a quarterly basis thereafter. In the event TC3 fails to provide written notice of an adjustment in USER's Annual Payment Amount by April 1, there shall be no adjustment to the Annual Payment Amount on May 1st for the ensuing year.

With respect to the Annual Payment Amount due hereunder, the **USER** shall pay to TC³ at least one-quarter of said Annual Payment Amount per quarter. The **USER** reserves the right to make prepayments for any number of quarters under this Agreement as it may elect.

USER shall pay amounts charged on quarterly invoices within forty-five (45) days after billing. Should **USER** fail to pay charges within said forty-five (45) day period, **USER** shall be assessed interest on the delinquent payment at a rate equal to the maximum authorized by the Bond Authorization Act, as amended, at the time the payment becomes delinquent. Should the **USER** have any representation on the Governance Board or the Operations Committee of TC³ at the time a payment becomes delinquent, **USER** shall not be entitled to further voting privileges on the Governance Board or the Operations Committee, nor shall any representative hold any office until such time as all delinquent payments and interest have been paid.

If the **USER** fails to make a quarterly payment for three successive months after an invoice becomes delinquent, TC³ shall be permitted to suspend any and all services in accordance with Section 8 of this Agreement.

8. PROCEDURE FOR SUSPENSION OF SERVICE. The procedure for suspending service shall be as follows: TC³ shall send **USER** a notice, certified, return receipt requested, of the date on which TC³ shall terminate service, which such date shall be at least thirty (30) days after the date the notice is sent to **USER**. Prior to suspension, **USER** may request that the Governance Board set a hearing at which the Board shall review any claim of **USER** as to the reasons for noncompliance with the terms of this Agreement. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Board may: (1) suspend service to **USER**; (2) find compliance by **USER**; (3) warn **USER**; or (4) grant **USER** a period of time to comply with the terms of the

Agreement. If additional time is granted to comply with the terms of the Agreement, the Board shall set a subsequent hearing to review **USER's** compliance with the terms of the Board's order. At the second hearing herein provided, the Board may exercise any option it could have exercised upon the original hearing.

- 9. EQUIPMENT. TC³ reserves the right to make modifications, repairs or replacements, or add options or accessories to its equipment for the purpose of improving service and/or function. In the event any modifications or improvements are proposed which require the USER or TC³ to make expenditures to update, modify, or replace equipment or procedures to maintain compatibility with the systems of TC³ or the USER, then at least a thirty (30) day notice of such proposal shall be given to TC³ or the USER before converting or modifying the system. Any expense involved in making modifications or adding options or accessories to User's equipment to maintain its compatibility with TC³'s system shall be solely that of the User. Ownership to said equipment shall be vested in the USER. Upon termination of this agreement, the USER shall have the right to remove said equipment; however, said equipment shall be removed by a technician designated by TC³.
- **10. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT.** This Agreement shall continue in full force and effect, subject to the suspension provisions above referenced, until termination by either party upon written notice to the other of not less than sixty days before the start of any quarter (based upon TC³'s fiscal year which shall run from May 1 April 30) or any time upon mutual agreement.
- 11. WARRANTY. The undersigned signatories individually and in their public capacity hereby warrant to TC³ that they are authorized by the corporate authorities of the USER to execute this Agreement and said Agreement is binding upon the USER, and all necessary corporate actions have been taken authorizing the execution of this Agreement.
- **12. INDEMNITY.** Each Party shall, and does agree to, indemnify the other Party and its elected and appointed offices, officials, attorneys, employees, and hold them harmless from any claim, injury, or loss, no matter how sustained, arising out of or related in any way to the provision of police, fire protection, or emergency medical services by TC³, or the use of, or the disruption or failure of, Dispatch Service pursuant to this Agreement. It is expressly understood by both Parties to this Agreement, that the obligation to indemnify each Party as set forth above does not apply to any act, failure to act, or conduct of the other Party, its officers, officials, attorneys, or employees for the negligent or willful or wanton acts and omission of such persons.
- 13. NOTICES. Notices to be provided under this Agreement shall be in writing, and shall be considered to be delivered to the party when deposited in the U.S. Mail, postage pre-paid by certified mail to the parties at the following addresses, or at such other addresses or in such a manner as the parties may so designate, in writing, from time to time:

AGREEMENT FOR DISPATCH SERVICES (Animal Control)

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between TAZEWELL COUNTY CONSOLIDATED COMMUNICATIONS, an intergovernmental agency created pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq., (hereinafter called "TC3") and TAZEWELL COUNTY (hereinafter called "USER").

WHEREAS, as a result of State law requiring the consolidation of the four (4) public safety answering points ("PSAPs") located in Tazewell County down to two (2) PSAPs, an intergovernmental agency known as TC³ was created pursuant to an Intergovernmental Agreement by and between the City of Pekin, the City of East Peoria, the City of Washington, the Village of Morton, Tazewell County, the Tazewell County Sheriff, and the **T**azewell County Emergency Telephone System Board, for the purpose of overseeing the operations of the two PSAPs, which such two PSAPs shall provide 9-1-1 telephone call taking, dispatch, and related services to public safety agencies located in Tazewell County; and

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND THE COUNTY OF Taywell

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1 et seq.) and the Constitution of the State of Illinois (Article 7, Paragraph 10) permit State agencies and governmental units to cooperate together in the performance of their responsibilities by contracts and other agreements; and

WHEREAS, this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) does not preempt or contradict in any manner any statutory duties or authority required of or granted to the Parties.

WHEREAS, the purpose of this MOU is to allow for interoperability of data between the Parties in order to exchange information for the benefit of the Parties and the residents of Illinois.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the Parties mutually agree to the provisions set forth herein.

- 1. Data to be shared by County Tax Assessor Office: The County Tax Assessor Office shall make available and share its digital geographic data (GIS data) including the following Data Attributes:
 - A. Parcel Boundary Data Attributes: PIN, Acres, Landowner, Property Class Code.
- **2.** Data to be shared by IDNR: IDNR shall make available and share its digital geographic data (GIS data) as available, including the following Data Attributes for these programs:
- A. Conservation Stewardship program (CSP) Data Attributes: Landowner Name, Listed Acres, Calculated Acres, Date Mapped, Date of Last Map Revision
- B. Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP) Data Attributes: CREP ID#, Listed Acres, Calculated Acres, Duration, Date of Last Map Revision, Practice. However, IDNR shall not disclose any data that is prohibited from disclosure by Federal or State Law unless the prohibited disclosures can be removed by redaction.
- C. Forestry Development Act Data Attributes: Plan ID, Landowner Name, Plan Start Date, Duration of Plan, Acres involved.
- **3. Data to be shared with IDOR:** IDNR and the County will share data with IDOR for the purpose of confirming Real Estate Tax Assessments for real estate identified in the data sharing.

- **4. License:** The Parties recognize that some of the data to be shared is copyrighted original works. It is being licensed for use, not sold. The Parties reserve all rights of authorship granted under U.S and International copyright laws, and all Parties grant the other a license to use such data. However, the reproduction or redistribution of licensed data outside the terms of this MOU is expressly forbidden. None of the data shall be electronically duplicated by any means for use by another party, in whole or in part without the express written permission of the respective licensor. Unless otherwise specified in this MOU or a written amendment hereto, this geographic data will only be used and operated by the Parties to this MOU.
- 5. **Permitted Usage of Geographic Data:** The Parties agree to hold all data in confidence and each Party agrees that it shall not, during the term of this MOU or after the termination of this MOU, re-disclose to any person or entity any data obtained by it unless such use or re-disclosure is permitted or required by applicable law. The Parties shall only use and retain the data in accordance with applicable law. The Parties shall promptly notify the other Parties of the discovery of any use of data inconsistent with this paragraph and shall promptly use all reasonable means to end any illegal or prohibited use of data.

Permitted Uses:

- A. Installation of, storage, load and display of the data on as many local area network and/or end user workstations as the Party reasonably needs.
- B. Modification or merger of digital data with other data sets or files: however, any portion of the digital data modified or merged continues to be subject to the conditions of this MOU.
- C. Use of the data for analysis and planning associated with the specific conservation objectives of the parties.

Prohibited Uses:

- A. Publication or presentation of graphic displays and printed tabular listings derived from the data is prohibited without prior permission from the data owner.
- B. Any sale, distribution, loan, or offering for use of the data, in whole or in part, is prohibited without prior permission from the data owner.
- **6. Security:** Each Party shall, through its agents, employees, and independent contractors, have the ability to monitor and audit all access to and use of its systems and the data. Each party agrees to employ security controls so that data transmittal will not introduce any viruses, worms, malware or other malicious software. All Parties shall be responsible for procuring and assuring that its users have or have access to all equipment and software necessary to fulfill its goals and responsibilities under this MOU. The IDNR will house the data sharing website and ensure all necessary security controls needed and required by the State of Illinois Department of Innovation and Technology (DoIT) standards are met.
- **7. Privacy:** Each Party shall comply with applicable laws including, but not limited to, the Personal Information Protection Act (815 ILCS 530 et seq.), the Identity Protection Act (5 ILCS 179 et seq.), and the Illinois Freedom of Information Act (5 ILCS 140/1 et seq.) to maintain the privacy and confidentiality and security of data and prevent use or disclosure of data other than as permitted by this MOU or applicable law. To the extent any Party uses outside vendors, each party shall inform such vendor of the terms of this agreement and require the vendor to comply with the security and privacy provisions hereof.

- **8. Requests for Data:** Each Party is solely responsible for obtaining current updated data. All updates will be covered by and subject to the terms of this MOU. Each Party shall immediately notify the other Parties when a Party receives a Freedom of Information Act Request, subpoena, court order or other third-party request related to the data. The Parties shall then confer to determine whether the information requested contains identifiable or confidential information and whether it shall be released. The final decision as to whether data should be disclosed pursuant to the request shall rest with the IDNR pursuant to applicable law. Nothing in this paragraph shall require a Party not to comply with a valid court order.
- **9. Treatment of Data:** The Parties agree to hold all data in confidence and agree that it shall not, during the term of this MOU or after the termination of this MOU, re-disclose to any person or entity any data obtained by it unless such use or re-disclosure is permitted or required by applicable law. The Parties do not guarantee, nor are they responsible for, the accuracy of shared data obtained from other sources.
- **10. Term:** This MOU shall become effective upon the date of the last signature below, and the initial term shall be for a period of one year from the effective date. Upon the expiration of the initial term, this MOU shall automatically renew for successive one year terms unless terminated by the Parties hereto. Any Party may terminate this agreement by providing 90 days written notice to the other Parties.

- **12. Governing Law:** This MOU shall be governed by and construed in accordance with laws of the State of Illinois, without regard to its conflicts of laws principles. Any claim against the State or a State agency arising out of this MOU must be filed exclusively within the Illinois Court of Claims (705 ILCS 505/1 *et seq.*), when said claim is within the jurisdiction of the Court of Claims.
- **13. Force Majeure:** No Party shall be liable for failing to fulfill any obligation under this MOU to the extent such failure is caused by an event beyond such Party's reasonable control and which event is not caused by such Party's fault or negligence. Such events shall include acts of God, acts of war or terrorism, fires, lightning, floods, epidemics, or riots.
- **14. No Joint Venture:** This MOU shall in no event be construed in such a way that any Party constitutes, or is deemed to be, the representative, agent, employee, partner, or joint venture of another Party. The

Parties shall not have the authority to enter into any agreement, nor to assume any liability, on behalf of the other Parties, nor to bind or commit the other Parties in any manner, except as expressly provided herein.

- **15. Waiver:** No term or provision of this MOU shall be deemed waived, and no breach or default shall be deemed excused, unless such waiver or consent shall be in writing and signed by the Party claimed to have waived or consented. No consent by any Party to, or waiver of, a breach or default by the other, whether express or implied, shall constitute a consent to, waiver of, or excuse for any different or subsequent breach or default by or on the part of any Party.
- **16. Survival:** Any provisions of this MOU that impose continuing obligations upon a Party or, by their nature of terms, would be reasonably understood to have been intended to survive and continue in force and effect after expiration or termination of this MOU, shall remain in force and effect after such expiration or termination for so long as so intended.
- 17. Governmental Immunity: Notwithstanding anything to the contrary set forth elsewhere in this MOU, none of the Parties have, and in no event shall any of them be construed to have, waived any rights or defenses of governmental immunity that they may have with respect to any matters arising out of this MOU or performance hereunder.
- **18. Entire Agreement/Amendment:** This MOU constitutes the entire agreement and supersedes any prior oral or written agreements between the Parties. Any Amendment to this MOU must be in writing.
- 19. Counterparts/Signatures: This MOU may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original as against the Parties whose signature appears thereon but all of which taken together shall constitute but one and the same instrument. The signatories to this MOU warrant that they are fully authorized to execute this MOU on behalf of their respective Party and that all necessary authorizations have been taken to grant such authority.
- **20. Ownership:** Any data provided by a Party shall remain the property of the Party disclosing the data even after it is provided to another Party. A recipient Party shall not obtain any right, title or ownership interest in the data.
- **21. Court Order or Subpoena:** In the event, that any data is required to be disclosed in response to a valid Freedom of Information Act Request, a valid court order, or subpoena, only the minimal necessary date shall be disclosed to the extent necessary. Any Party receiving such request, court order or subpoena shall immediately notify the Parties and any Party may seek a protective order.

Questions

- How accurate are the boundaries for the mapped conservation programs?
 Accuracy varies depending on how long ago it was mapped and what the available technologies were at the time. Call the appropriate IDNR staff to get clarification for specific properties.
- 2. Will there be GIS data for every county? Not necessarily. FDA data is updated by year, so every county has been mapped and they are as current as mapping progress allows. CSP data is updated by county on a weekly basis. Most properties have been mapped and verifications of old property maps are ongoing. CREP data is current and easement boundary lines are being updated and edited regularly. However, please note that not every county is eligible for the CREP program.
- 3. What should I do when I see an IDNR conservation program on a parcel?
 If a parcel has an IDNR conservation program on it, it may be eligible for a tax benefit. Please refer to the tax fact sheet found here:
 https://www.dnr.illinois.gov/conservation/CREP/Documents/MoreInfoLinkTaxSheet.pdf
- 4. What is the benefit to sharing this GIS data with each other?

 Ultimately, private landowners will benefit the most by this Data Sharing Agreement. Having all parties on the same page will make it quicker and easier to assess the land, and give the landowner any appropriate tax benefit. County Tax Assessors will get the most up to date GIS layers of showing IDNR's conservation programs. IDNR will benefit by having accurate property boundary lines to be used to update Conservation Program GIS layers and verify property ownership.
- 5. Should I notify IDNR if certain changes occur on a property with a known Conservation Program? Yes. As available resources for monitoring and compliance checks decrease, it is becoming more important to rely on aerial imagery, LiDAR, and most importantly help from outside IDNR. Any landuse change could impact the ability to achieve the goals of the conservation program, and these changes should be brought to the attention of the appropriate program staff at IDNR so that they can work with the landowner as soon as possible. Examples of such changes could be: a new building/structure, a timber harvest, new commercial activity, etc.



IDNR Forest and Conservation Program Benefits for Private Landowners

FOREST DEVELOPMENT ACT (FDA)

- 10 acre minimum; forested ac primarily (does include tree plantings and up to 10% related, integrated, associated, non-forest conservation use).
- Management plan required. Must meet IL Forest Management Plan standards.
- · Conduct management as outlined in plan.
- Cost share may be available through FDA and NRCS programs.
- Taxes based on farmland assessment, soil type and productivity. FDA acres are assessed at 1/6th farmland tax assessment.
- FDA certification must be approved by management plan preparer, landowner, and district forester.
- Plans are re-written every ten years.
 Certifications can be renewed under existing plan number.
- Plans can be transferred to the purchaser of the land. The new landowner must contact district forester and meet eligibility.
- · Legal access is preferred, but not mandatory.

CONSERVATION STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM (CSP)

- 5 acre minimum; undeveloped forestland, grassland, or wetland area.
- Management plan can be written by landowner.
 Plan must have a majority of the components of the IL Forest Management Plan.
- Conduct management as outlined in the plan.
- Cost share is not available, however funds may be on availability basis through IL Recreational Access Program (IRAP).
- Taxes based on Fair Market Value (FMV) of the property. Residential and recreational property is assessed at 33.33% FMV. Approved enrollees can benefit from a reduced assessment to 5% FMV.
- · Certifications must be signed by landowner.
- Enrollment is for ten years. A new application and plan must be submitted at that time.
- Plans and enrollments cannot be transferred at time of sale, however new landowner is able to apply upon taking possession of the property.
- · Legal access is required.

CONSERVATION RESERVE ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM (CREP)

- 20 acre minimum for permanent easement or an entire farm field currently enrolled in federal CREP and within the 100 year floodplain.
- Management plan is recommended but not required. Landowner should follow guidelines of the Conservation Plan of Operations (CPO).
- Landowners should follow the guidelines of the CREP easement and any management plan they have in place.
- · Cost share is available on cropped acres.
- Preferential tax assessment may be available by completing the P-TAX-337-R and sending to IDNR for approval. Property tax can be reduced to 8.33% FMV in counties with population less than 200,000, 25% FMV in counties over 200,000.
- CREP is offered as either a 15 or 35 year extension of a federal CRP contract, or as a permanent easement which can include additional non-cropped acres.
- CREP extensions and permanent easements run with the land and are not extinguishable before expiration. Release from the program is not authorized.
- Legal access is required.

6 TCC 3-1. Definitions

In addition to the definitions contained in the Illinois Department of Public Health Food Service Sanitation Code and Retail Food Sanitation Code the following general definitions shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of this ordinance:

ANNUAL PERMIT hereafter known as permit, shall mean a food license good from January 1 of the current year through December 31 of the current year.

<u>APPROVED</u>- acceptable to the Board of Health based on its determination as to conformance with good health practices and standards.

ADULTERATED- the condition of food if it:

- 1. bears or contains any poisonous or deleterious substance in a quantity which may render it injurious to health;
- 2. consists in whole or in part of any filthy, putrid, or decomposed substance, or if it is otherwise unfit for human consumption;
- 3. has been processed, prepared, packed or held under insanitary conditions, whereby it may have become contaminated with filth, or whereby it may have been rendered injurious to health; or
- 4. is in whole or in part of the product of a diseased animal which has died otherwise than by slaughter.

5. Its container is composed in whole or in part of any poisonous or deleterious substance which may render the contents injurious to health.

APPLICANT any person making application to the Board of Health for a permit

<u>AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE</u> those persons designated by the Board of Health to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance.

<u>BOARD OF HEALTH</u> shall mean the Tazewell County Board of Health as the regulatory authority or its authorized representatives.

<u>CATEGORY I FACILITY</u> means a food service establishment that presents a high relative risk of causing foodborne illness based upon the large number of food handling operations typically implicated in foodborne outbreaks and/or the type of population served by the facility. Category I facilities include those where the following operations occur:

- 1. Cooling of time/temperature control for safety (TCS) foods occurs as part of the food handling operation at the facility;
- 2. TCS foods are prepared hot or cold and held hot or cold for more than 12 hours;
- 3. TCS foods cooked and cooled are reheated for hot holding;
- 4. Complex preparation of foods, extensive handling of raw occurs as part of the food handling operations at the facility;
- 5. Vacuum packaging, curing/ smoking meat to preserve it, pasteurizing juice on site for sale; shellfish life-support tanks; sprouting seeds and beans; and/or other forms of reduced oxygen packaging are performed at the retail level; fermentation of foods and/or altering the pH to modify the TCS quality of the food.
- 6. Immuno-compromised individuals are served, where these individuals compromise the majority of the consuming population.

<u>CATEGORY II FACILITY</u> means a food service establishment that presents a moderate relative risk of causing foodborne illness based upon few food handling operations typically implicated in foodborne illness outbreaks. Category II facilities include those where the following operations occur:

- 1. Hot or cold foods are held at that temperature for no more than 12 hours and are restricted to same day services;
- 2. Foods prepared from raw ingredients use only minimal assembly; or

3. Foods that require complex preparation (whether canned, frozen, or fresh prepared) are obtained from approved food processing plants, or Category I Retail Food Service Establishments.

<u>CATEGORY III FACILITY</u> means a food service establishment that presents a low relative risk of causing foodborne illness based upon few or no food handling operations typically implicated in foodborne illness outbreaks. Category III facilities include those where the following operations occur:

- Only pre-packaged foods are available or served in the facility, and any time/temperature controlled for safety are commercially pre-packaged in an approved processing plant;
- 2. Only limited preparations of non-time/ temperature controlled for safety and beverages, such as snack foods and carbonated beverages, occurs at the facility; or
- 3. Only beverages (alcoholic or non-alcoholic) are served at the facility.

<u>CERTIFIED FOOD PROTECTION MANAGER</u> is any individual who has completed a minimum of 8 hours of Illinois Department of Public Health-approved training for food service sanitation manager certification, inclusive of the examination, and received a passing score on the examination set by the certification exam provider accredited under standards developed and adopted by the Conference for Food Protection or its successor organization, shall be considered to be a certified food service sanitation manager and maintains a valid certificate.

<u>CODE</u> means the administrative rules adopted by the Illinois Department of Public Health pertaining to food establishments found at 77 IL Adm. Code 750 "Food Service Sanitation Code

CORE ITEM-

- 1. <u>"Core item"</u> means a provision in this Code that is not designated as a priority item or a priority foundation item.
- 2. <u>"Core item"</u> includes an item that usually relates to general sanitation, operational controls, sanitation standard operating procedures (SSOPs), facilities or structures, equipment design, or general maintenance.

<u>EQUIPMENT</u>- stoves, ovens, ranges, hoods, slicers, mixers, meat blocks, tables, counters, refrigerators, sinks, dishwashing machines, steam tables, and similar items other than utensils, used in the operation of a food service establishment.

<u>EXEMPT</u>- are those organizations that are not required to pay an annual retail food service establishment permit fee.

<u>EXEMPT ORGANIZATIONS</u>- defined by the Tazewell County Board includes schools, churches, veteran/military organizations and governmental taxing bodies such as park districts, libraries, fire districts, police departments and townships.

<u>FOOD</u>- any raw, cooked, or processed edible substance, ice, beverage or ingredient used or intended for use or for sale in whole or in part for human consumption.

<u>FOOD HANDLER (FOOD EMPLOYEE)</u>- any individual working with unpackaged food, food equipment or utensils, or food contact surfaces. "Food handler" does not include unpaid volunteers in a food establishment, whether permanent or temporary.

GOOD RETAIL PRACTICES- food safety management system to control basic operational and sanitation conditions within a food establishment.

<u>HACCP PLAN-</u> A written document that delineates the formal procedures for following the Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Points principles developed by The National Advisory Committee on Microbiological Criteria for Foods.

LOCAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT- the Tazewell County Health Department (TCHD).

<u>MISBRANDED</u>- shall mean the presence of any written, printed, or graphic matter upon or accompanying food or containers of food which is false or misleading.

<u>PERMIT</u> the document issued by the **Board of Health** that authorizes a person to operate a food establishment.

<u>PERMIT HOLDER</u> the entity that is legally responsible for the operation of the food establishment, such as owner, the owner's agent or other person, and possesses a valid permit to operate the food establishment.

<u>PERSON</u> -any individual, partnership, corporation, association, or other legal entity government or governmental subdivision or agency.

<u>PERSON IN CHARGE (PIC)</u> means the individual present at a food establishment who is responsible for the operation at the time of inspection.

<u>PLAN REVIEW</u> an evaluation process conducted by the Board of Health to ensure that food establishments are built or renovated according to current Code regulations or rules; to establish an organized and efficient flow of food; and to eliminate code violations prior to construction.

<u>PREMISES</u> the physical facility, its contents, and the contiguous land or property under the control of the permit holder.

PRIORITY ITEM-

1. "Priority items" means a provision in this Code whose application contributes directly to the elimination, prevention or reduction to an acceptable level, hazards associated with

foodborne illness or injury and there is no other provision that more directly controls the hazard.

- 2. <u>"Priority items"</u> includes items with a quantifiable measure to show control of hazards such as cooking, reheating, cooling, handwashing; and
- 3. <u>"Priority items"</u> is an item that is denoted in this Code with a superscript P-P-

PRIORITY FOUNDATION ITEM-

- 1. <u>"Priority foundation items"</u> means a provision in this Code whose application supports, facilitates or enables one or more priority items.
- "Priority foundation items" includes an item that requires the purposeful incorporation
 of specific actions, equipment or procedures by industry management to attain control
 of risk factors that contribute to foodborne illness or injury such as personnel training,
 infrastructure or necessary equipment, HACCP plans, documentation or record
 keeping, and labeling; and
- 3. $\frac{\text{"Priority foundation items"}}{\text{f.}}$ is an item that is denoted in this Code with a superscript Pf -

<u>REMODEL</u>- altering the structure (does not include cosmetic remodel)

EXTENSIVE REMODEL OR CHANGE OF OWNER: 75% or greater of facility or any change in ownership.

- 100 to 1,000 Square Feet \$150.00.
- Over 1,000 to 10,000 Square Feet -\$225.00.
- Over 10,000 Square Feet and Up \$300.00.

MINOR REMODEL: Less than 75% of facility.

- 100 to 1,000 Square Feet \$100.00.
- Over 1,000 to 10,000 Square Feet -\$150.00.
- Over 10,000 Square Feet and Up \$200.00.

RETAIL FOOD SERVICE ESTABLISHMENT- an operation that stores, prepares, packages, serves, vends food directly to the consumer or any place where food is prepared and intended for, though not limited to, individual portion service, and includes the site at which individual portions are provided. The term includes any such place regardless of whether consumption is on or off the premises and regardless of whether there is a charge for the food. The term also includes delicatessen type operations that prepare foods intended for individual portion service. The term does not include lodging facilities serving only a continental breakfast (a continental breakfast is one limited to only coffee, tea, and/or juice and commercial prepared sweet baked goods), private events, private homes or a closed family function where food is prepared or served for individual family consumption.

<u>SANITIZATION</u> means the application of cumulative heat or chemicals on cleaned food-contact surfaces that, when evaluated for efficacy, is sufficient to yield a reduction of 5 logs, which is equal to a 99.999% reduction, of representative disease microorganisms of public health importance.

<u>SEASONAL FOOD SERVICE ESTABLISHMENT</u>- shall mean a food service operation, that is operated for not more than six months in a licensing period.

<u>SINGLE SERVICE UTENSILS</u>- cups, containers, lids, closures, plates, knives, forks, spoons, stirrers, paddles, straws, napkins, wrapping materials, toothpicks, and similar articles for one-time, one person use and then discarded.

<u>SANITATION STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE</u> (SSOP) is a written document of procedures or programs used to maintain an environment in a sanitary condition for food processes to reduce or eliminate foodborne illness risk factors. This also includes temperature monitoring systems and verification.

STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE (SOP) It is a step-by-step description of cleaning and sanitizing procedures to reduce or eliminate hazards concerning good retail practices.

<u>TEMPORARY FOOD ESTABLISHMENT</u>- a food service establishment that operates at a fixed location for a period of time of not more than 14 consecutive days in conjunction with a single special event or celebration.

<u>TEMPORARY FOOD PERMIT</u>- is issued to any facility meeting the temporary food service guidelines provided from the Tazewell County Health Department. Category III facilities who wish to provide food for a special event requiring activities that are not permitted under their current retail food service establishment permit must apply for a temporary food permit. A temporary food permit must be obtained if any food service establishment operates offsite from where their food service establishment permit is issued.

<u>TIME/TEMPERATURE CONTROL FOR SAFETY FOOD</u> (formerly "potentially hazardous food" (PHF)).

- 1) "Time/temperature control for safety food" means a FOOD that requires time/temperature control for safety (TCS) to limit pathogenic microorganism growth or toxin formation.
- 2) "Time/temperature control for safety food" includes:

- a) An animal FOOD that is raw or heat-treated; a plant FOOD that is heat treated or consists of raw seed sprouts, cut melons, cut leafy greens, cut tomatoes or mixtures of cut tomatoes that are not modified in a way so that they are unable to support pathogenic microorganism growth or toxin formation, or garlic-in-oil mixtures that are not modified in a way so that they are unable to support pathogenic microorganism growth or toxin formation; and
- b) Except as specified in Subparagraph (3)(d) of this definition, a FOOD that because of the interaction of its AW and PH values is designated as Product Assessment Required (PA) in Table A or B of this definition

3) "Time/temperature control for safety food" does not include:

- a) An air-cooled hard-boiled egg with shell intact, or an egg with shell intact that is not hard-boiled, but has been pasteurized to destroy all viable salmonellae;
- b) A food in an unopened hermetically sealed container that is commercially

^{**} PA means Product Assessment required

- processed to achieve and maintain commercial sterility under conditions of non-refrigerated storage and distribution;
- c) A food that because of its pH or Aw value, or interaction of Aw and pH values, is designated as a non-TCS food in Table A or B of this definition;
- d) A food that is designated as Product Assessment Required (PA) in Table A or B of this definition and has undergone a Product Assessment showing that the growth or toxin formation of pathogenic microorganisms that are reasonably likely to occur in that food is precluded due to:
 - i. Intrinsic factors including added or natural characteristics of the food such as preservatives, antimicrobials, humectants, acidulants, or nutrients,
 - ii. Extrinsic factors including environmental or operational factors that affect the food such as packaging, modified atmosphere such as reduced oxygen packaging, shelf life and use, or temperature range of storage and use, or
 - iii. A combination of intrinsic and extrinsic factors; or
- e) A food that does not support the growth or toxin formation of pathogenic microorganisms in accordance with one of the Subparagraphs (3)(a) (3)(d) of this definition even though the food may contain a pathogenic microorganism or chemical or physical contaminant at a level sufficient to cause illness or injury.

<u>UTENSIL</u>- any implement used in the storage, preparation, transportation, or service of food.

<u>VARIANCE</u> a written document issued by the *Board of Health* that authorizes a modification or waiver of one or more requirements of the Code

<u>WHOLESOME</u>- in sound condition, clean, free from contamination, and otherwise suitable for use as human food.

6 TCC 3-2. Applicable Laws and Regulations

The administrative rules adopted by the Illinois Department of Public Health pertaining to retail food establishments found at 77 IL Adm. Code 750 "Food Service Sanitation Code" and all subsequent amendments are hereby adopted by reference. The Board of Health is authorized to adopt rules to carry out the purpose of this ordinance. Three certified copies

of each shall be on file in the office of the Tazewell County Clerk's Office.

6 TCC 3-3. Plan Submission and Approval

- 1) When a retail food service establishment is constructed or the areas in which food is prepared and stored are extensively remodeled, or an existing structure is converted for use as a food service establishment, or changes ownership the plans and specifications for such construction, remodeling, or alteration shall be submitted to the Board of Health in a manner prescribed by the Board of Health for approval before such work has begun. When an existing retail food service establishment changes ownership, a new permit will be required and plans, and specifications submitted. The plans and specifications shall indicate the proposed layout, arrangement, mechanical plans, and construction materials of work areas where food is prepared and stored and the location, size, and type of equipment and facilities. A menu of food items expected to be prepared at the establishment must be submitted including sanitation standard operating procedures. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require the Board of Health approval of changes in the menu.
- 2) Whenever plans and specifications are required to be submitted to the Board of Health, the Board of Health's authorized representative shall inspect the Retail Food Service Establishment prior to the start of the operations, to determine compliance with the approval plans and specifications, and with the requirements of this ordinance.
- 3) For a food service establishment that is required to have a HACCP plan by the code, the plan specifications shall: include:
 - a) Food employee and supervisory training plan that addresses the food safety issues of concern.
 - b) Description of the product formulation and its intended use;
 - c) Flow diagram or operational procedures for the food preparation process indicating critical control points;
 - d) Hazards associated with each critical control point and preventative measures
 - e) Monitoring systems
 - f) Corrective actions plans for deviations from the critical limits
 - g) Record keeping procedures
 - h) Procedures for verification of HACCP system
 - 1) The Board of Health shall treat as confidential in accordance with the law information relating to trade secrets and recipe formulation.

6 TCC 3-4. Enforcement Provisions

1. Permits: It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a Retail Food Service

Establishment within the County of Tazewell who does not possess a valid permit which shall be issued annually by the Board of Health. Only a person who complies with the requirements of this ordinance shall be entitled to receive and retain such a permit. Permits shall not be transferable from one person and place to another person and place. A valid permit shall be posted in conspicuous view of the public in every food service establishment. Permits for permanent Retail Food Service Establishment shall expire on December 31st of the year issued. Permits for temporary retail food service establishments shall be issued for a period not to exceed 14 consecutive days.

- a) Issuance of Permits: Any person desiring to operate a food service establishment or or renew an expired permit shall make a written application for a permit at least one week prior to the date of opening and or expiration of permit on forms provided by the Board of Health. Such application shall be completed and signed by the owner or his/her representative and shall include the following:
 - i. The applicant's full name, address, and whether such an applicant is an individual, firm or corporation. If a partnership, the names of partners and their addresses;
 - ii. The full name(s), addresses, certified food protection manager number(s), and certificate expirations date(s) of the full time managerial staff person(s) designated as the certified food manager(s);
 - iii. The address of the Retail Food Service Establishment
 - iv. The billing address of the Retail Food Service Establishment
 - v. The type of food service
 - vi. Whether the facility has changed its menu items or food handling practices in the last year; and
 - vii. The appropriate fee(s).
 - viii. Such fees shall be non-refundable and payable upon receipt of an invoice issued by the Board of Health.
 - ix. Fees for permits issued after June 30 shall be prorated
 - x. When satisfied that the applicable requirements of this ordinance have been met, a permit shall be issued to the applicant by the Board of Health.
 - xi. Permits for permanent retail food service establishment shall expire on

December 31st of the year issued.

- b) Renewal of Permits: Whenever the review of the inspections for the previous year reveals repeated priority, priority foundation or core items, the permit may not be issued and the Board of Health shall notify the applicant immediately thereof. Such notice shall state the reasons for not renewing the permit. Such notice shall also state that an opportunity for a hearing shall be provided for the applicant at a time and place designated by the Board of Health. Such a hearing shall be scheduled not later than 10 days from the date of notice. The notice referred to in this paragraph shall be delivered to the applicant in person by the Board of Health or may be sent by registered mail, return receipt requested. A permit, which has expired, shall be removed from the establishment by the Board of Health.
- c) Food Permit Fees: The annual fees for food permits shall be:

 - 1. Category I Food Permit \$350.00
 - 2. Category II Food Permit \$250.00
 - 3. Category III Food Permit \$150.00
 - ii. SEASONAL FOOD PERMIT FEES:
 - 1. Category I Food Permit \$175.00
 - 2. Category II Food Permit \$125.00
 - 3. Category III Food Permit \$ 75.00
 - iii. PLAN REVIEW FEES (NEW):
 - 1. Category I Food Permit \$400.00
 - 2. Category II Food Permit \$400.00
 - 3. Category III Food Permit \$400.00
 - iv. PLAN REVIEW (REMODEL AND CHANGE OF OWNER):
 - 1. Category I Food Permit \$100.00 \$300.00
 - 2. Category II Food Permit \$100.00 \$300.00
 - 3. Category III Food Permit \$100.00 \$300.00
 - v. TEMPORARY FOOD PERMIT FEES:
 - 1. Within 5 working days or more notice: per event \$20.00
 - 2. With less than 5 working day notice per event \$30.00
 - 3. With less than five working day's notice the second time or

- beyond per event \$75.00
- 4. On-Site / Day of Event per event \$40.00
- 5. On-Site / Day of Event the second time per event \$100.00 Multiple
- 6. Pre-Pay Number of events x \$18.00
- d) Penalty Fees for late renewal shall be assessed as follows:
 - i. BOTH EXEMPT AND NON-EXEMPT
 - 1. LATE FEES (Beginning Jan 1 –Jan 10) Food Permit Late Fee \$100.00
 - 2. LATE FEES (Beginning Jan 11 31st): Food Permit Late Fee \$100.00
 - a. Plus, Per Day Surcharge Number of Days x \$5.00
 - 3. LATE FEES (on February 1st)
 - Food Permit Terminated Permit Holder Must Re-Apply For New Food Permit (A Plan Review WILL be Required) Late Fees Will Apply
- e) Suspension of Permits: Permits may be suspended by the Board of Health for failure of the permit holder to comply with the requirements of this ordinance. A permit holder or operator shall be notified in writing that the permit is, upon service of the notice, immediately suspended and that an opportunity for a hearing will be provided if a written request for a hearing is filed with the Board of Health by the permit holder. Upon suspension of the permit, the permit shall be removed from the establishment by the Board of Health and returned to the Health Department. Notwithstanding the other provisions of this ordinance. whenever the Board of Health finds unsanitary or other conditions in the operation of a retail food service establishment which in its judgment, constitutes an imminent threat to the public health, the Board of Health may without warning, notice or hearing, issue a written notice to the permit holder or operator citing such condition, specifying the corrective action to be taken, and specifying the time within such action shall be taken and if operations as a retail food service establishment are to be immediately discontinued. Any person to whom such an order is issued shall comply immediately therewith, but upon written petition to the Board of Health shall be afforded a hearing as soon as possible.
- f) Reinstatement of Suspended Permits: Any person whose permit has been

- suspended may at any time make application for a re-inspection for reinstatement of the permit. Within 10 days following the receipt of written request, including a statement signed by the applicant that in his opinion the conditions causing suspension of the permit has been corrected, the Board of Health shall make a re-inspection. If the applicant is complying with the requirements of this ordinance, the permit shall be reinstated.
- g) Revocation of Permits: For violations of any of the requirements of this ordinance, or for interference with the Board of Health in the performance of its duties, the permit may be permanently revoked after an opportunity for a hearing has been provided by the Board of Health. Prior to such action, the Board of Health shall notify the permit holder in writing, stating the reasons for which the permit is subject to revocation and advising that the permit shall be permanently revoked at the end of five days following service of such notice, unless a request for a hearing is filed with the Board of Health, by the permit holder, within such 5-day period. A permit may be suspended for a cause pending its revocation or a hearing relative thereto.
- h) Hearing: The hearings provided for in the ordinance shall be conducted by the Board of Health at a time and place designated by it. Any oral testimony given at a hearing shall be reported verbatim, and the presiding officer shall make a provision for sufficient copies of the transcript. The Board of Health shall make a final finding based upon the complete hearing record and shall sustain, modify, or rescind any notice or order considered in the hearing. A written report of the hearing decision shall be furnished to the holder of the permit by the Board of Health within 10 days.
- i) Application after Revocation: Whenever a revocation of a permit has become final, the holder of the revoked permit may make a written request for a new permit.

2. Inspections:

- a) Frequency of Inspections: Facilities shall be inspected at least as often as prescribed by the following schedule:
 - Category I Facilities shall receive a minimum of three inspections per year, or two inspections per year if one of the following conditions are met:
 - 1. A certified food protection manager is present at all time the facility is in operation (Incidental absences of the certified food service

- manager due to illness, short errands, off the premises, etc. shall not constitute a violation of this section, provided there is documentation that a certified food protection manager was scheduled to work at that time.
- 2. Employees involved in food operations receive a HACCP training exercise, in-service training in food service sanitations, or attend an educational conference or training on food safety or sanitation.
- ii. Category II Facilities shall receive a minimum of one inspection per year.
- iii. Category III Facilities shall receive a minimum of one inspection every two years.
- b) Right of Way: The Board of Health, after proper identification, shall be permitted to enter at any reasonable time any food service establishment in the County of Tazewell, State of Illinois, for making inspections to determine compliance with this ordinance. They shall be permitted to examine the records of the establishments to obtain pertinent information pertaining to food and supplies purchased, received, or used, persons employed, sanitation standard operating procedures and HACCP plans.
- c) Report of Inspection: Whenever an inspection of a food service establishment is made, the findings shall be recorded on an inspection report form provided for this purpose, and shall furnish a copy of such inspection report form to the permit holder or operator. Remarks from the inspection shall reference, by section number, the section of the code or ordinance violated and shall state the correction to be made. Upon completion of an inspection, the Board of Health shall document priority, priority foundation, core and good retail practices and timelines for correction. The completed inspection form is a public document and shall be made available for public disclosure to any person who requests it under the Freedom of Information Act.
- d) Correction of Violations: The timing and procedure for the correction of all violations noted shall be as provided in the Tazewell County Health Department Food Safety Enforcement Procedure.

3. Issuance of Notices

a) If an imminent health hazard exists, such as a complete lack of refrigeration, no running water or sewage backup, the establishment shall immediately cease food operations. Operations shall not be resumed until authorized by the

Board of Health.

- b) Timely Correction: (A) Except as specified in ¶ (B) of this section, a permit holder shall at the time of inspection correct a violation of a Priority Item or Priority Foundation Item of this Code and implement corrective actions for a HACCP Plan provision that is not in compliance with its Critical limit.
- c) Considering the nature of the potential hazard involved and the complexity of the corrective action needed, the Board of Health may agree to or specify a longer time frame, not to exceed:
 - i. 72 hours after the inspection, for the permit holder to correct violations of a Priority Item; or
 - ii. 10 calendar days after the inspection, for the permit holder to correct violations of a Priority Foundation Item or HACCP Plan deviations.
- d) In case of temporary establishments, all violations must be corrected prior to operation.

4. Service of Notices

Notices provided for under this section shall be deemed to have been properly served when a copy of the inspection report form or other notice has been delivered personally to the permit holder or person in charge, or such notice has been sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested to the last known address of the permit holder. A copy of such notice shall be filed with the records of the Board of Health.

5. Examination and Condemnation of Food and/or Equipment

a) Food may be examined or sampled by the Board of Health as may be necessary to determine freedom from adulteration or misbranding. The Board of Health may, upon written notice to owner or person in charge, place a hold order on any food which is determined or has probable cause to believe to be unwholesome or otherwise adulterated or misbranded. Under a hold order, food shall be permitted or be suitably stored. It shall be unlawful for any person to move or alter a hold order notice or tag placed on food by the Board of Health. Neither such food nor the containers thereof shall be relabeled, repackaged, or reprocessed, altered, disposed of, or destroyed without permission of the Board of Health, except on a order by a court of competent jurisdiction. After the owner or person in charge has had a hearing as provided in Section 6-3-4, and on the basis of evidence produced at such hearing, or on the basis of examination in the event of a written request for a hearing is not received within 10 days, the

Board of Health may vacate the hold order or may, by written order, direct the owner or person in charge of food which was placed under the hold order to denature or destroy such food or bring it into compliance with the provisions of this ordinance. Such order shall be stayed if the order is appealed to a court of competent jurisdiction within five days.

b) Where equipment used in the preparation of food products is found to be a public health hazard, unsafe, unsuitable for use, or unsanitary, such equipment shall be taken out of use and a hold order (embargo) placed on said items by the Board of Health. Such equipment will not be altered, disposed of, or destroyed without permission of the Board of Health, except on an order by a court of competent jurisdiction. After the owner or person in charge had a hearing as provided in Section 6-3-4, and based on evidence produced at such hearing, or on the basis of examination in the event of a written request for a hearing is not received within 10 days, the Board of Health may vacate the hold order or may, by written order, direct the owner or person in charge of the equipment that was placed under the hold order to destroy such equipment or bring it into compliance with the provisions of this ordinance. Such order shall be stayed if the order is appealed to a court of competent jurisdiction within five days.

6. Procedure When Infection is Suspected

When the Board of Health has reasonable cause to suspect possibility of disease transmission from any food service establishment employee, it shall secure a morbidity history for the suspected employee or make any other investigation as may be indicated, and take appropriate action. The Board of Health may require one or more of the following measures:

- i. Immediate exclusion of the employee from any food handling activities as described in the code.
- ii. Immediate closure of the establishment concerned until, in the opinion of the Board of Health, no further danger of disease outbreaks exists.
- iii. Restrictions of employee's services to some area of the establishment where there will be no danger of transmitting the disease.
- iv. Adequate medical and laboratory examinations of the employee or other employees and of his or their body discharges.

7. Variances

a) The regulatory authority may grant a variance by modifying or waiving the

- requirements of this Code if in the opinion of the regulatory authority a health hazard or nuisance will not result from this variance. If a variance is granted, the regulatory authority shall retain the information in its records for the food establishment.
- b) Before a variance from a Requirement of this Code is approved, the information that shall be provided by the person requesting the variance and retained in the regulatory authority's file on the food establishment includes:
 - i. A statement of the propose variance of the Code requirement citing relevant code section numbers;
 - ii. An analysis of the rationale for how the potential public health hazardous and nuisances addressed by the relevant Code sections will be alternatively addressed by the proposal; and
 - iii. A HACCP plan if required as specified as it is relevant to the variance requested.
 - iv. If the regulatory authority grants a variance, or a HACCP plan is otherwise required, the permit holder shall:
 - 1. Comply with the HACCP plans and procedures that are submitted and approved as a basis for the modification or waiver; and
 - 2. Maintain and provide to the regulatory authority, upon request, records that demonstrate that the following are routinely employed;
 - a. Procedures for monitoring the critical control points,
 - b. Monitoring of the Critical Control Points,
 - c. Verification of the effectiveness of the operation or process, and
 - d. Necessary corrective actions if there is a failure at the Critical Control Point.
 - v. Any person who requests a variance from the provisions of these regulations shall have the burden of supplying the Board of Health's authorized representative with information that demonstrates the conditions exist which warrants the granting of a variance. All uncertainties shall be resolved in the interest of the public's health and safety.
- c) The Board of Health may grant a variance if:
 - i. Such variance is consistent with the purpose and intent of the most

- current edition of the Illinois Food Service Code and its associated Acts and Codes and this Ordinance; and
- ii. It is consistent with the protection of the public health; and
- iii. In the opinion of the regulatory authority, a health hazard or nuisance will not result from the variance.
- d) A variance shall be revoked or expire if:
 - i. In the opinion of the Board of Health the variance results in a health hazard or nuisance; or
 - ii. There is a change of circumstances from those supporting the variance; or
 - iii. There is a change of ownership of the Retail Food Service Establishment.
- e) Any Retail Food Service Establishment for which the variance has been denied may appeal such denial by requesting a hearing before the Board of Health.

8. Equipment Standards

All new and replacement equipment shall meet or be equivalent to applicable National Sanitation Foundation (NSF) standards or, equivalent food equipment standards of another recognized testing agency that tests to NSF food equipment standards. If NSF food equipment standards do not exist for a piece of equipment, the equipment must be inspected and approved by this department before being placed into service.

6 TCC 3-5. Penalties

Any person who violated any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500.00. In addition, thereto, such persons may be enjoined from continuing such violations. Each day upon which such violation occurs shall be constitute a separate violation.

6 TCC 3-6. Repeal and Date of Effect

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its adoption as provided by law; and all previous versions of the Tazewell County Food Service Sanitation Ordinance, adopted

by County Board of Tazewell County, is hereby repealed

6 TCC 3-7. Unconstitutionality Clause

Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance be unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of said ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 7, CHAPTER 1, ZONING CODE OF TAZEWELL COUNTY

Proposed Amendment No. 50 (Zoning Board Case No. 18-24-A)

WHEREAS, an Amendment to the Tazewell County Zoning Code hereinafter was previously referred by the TAZEWELL COUNTY LAND USE COMMITTEE to the Zoning Board of Appeals for hearing; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on said Amendment was held June 5, 2018, following due publication of said hearing in accordance with law, and the said Zoning Board of Appeals thereafter made a report to this Board recommending approval; and

WHEREAS, said report of the Zoning Board of Appeals contained the following findings of fact:

- The proposed amendment shall not be detrimental to the orderly development of Tazewell
 County.
- 2. The proposed amendment shall not be detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, morals or general welfare of Tazewell County.

which findings of fact are hereby <u>accepted</u> by this Board as the reason for <u>Approving</u> the Amendment hereinafter authorized.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF TAZEWELL COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. ARTICLE 9 (RR) RURAL RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT

7TCC 1-9 (b) Permitted Uses. The following uses are permitted uses in the R-R District in accordance with the applicable regulations as set forth in this Ordinance:

(Delete areas a stricken and a new as bolded and italicized)

- (3) Agriculture, provided:

- (8) <u>CHICKENS/FOWL</u>. Specific requirements for chickens/fowl in the R-1 Low Density Residential District:

 - ii. Roosters shall be prohibited;
 - iii. The slaughtering of chickens/fowl shall not be allowed on-site, except for humane reasons;
 - iv. Chickens/fowl shall be kept for personal use only and shall be contained within a coop or enclosure / run at all times; No eggs or chickens/fowl shall be offered for sale on the premises.
 - v. The structure (coop) housing the chickens/fowl shall be located behind the rear plane of the existing dwelling (not in the front or side yard) and shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition at all times. Said coop shall be covered and ventilated to protect chickens/fowl from inclement weather and predators and shall provide a minimum of 4 square feet per chicken to allow

for free movement. Said coop shall be located 10' from the side and rear yard property lines and electric service to the coops shall not be provided by an extension cord.

- vi. Chickens/fowl shall have access to a fenced enclosure / run providing a minimum of 10 square feet per chicken to allow for outdoor time, said fenced enclosure or run shall be 10' from any side or rear yard property lines. Chickens/fowl shall not be allowed to run freely on a lot. A 50 foot minimum lateral distance from the fenced enclosure to any well, in clay or loam soils, shall be maintained. For other soils the Tazewell County Health Department may be called on for assistance in determining a proper distance.
- Coops and fenced enclosures/runs shall be a minimum of 30' away
 from any existing structure on any adjoining parcel, such as dwellings,
 patios, porches, gazebos, decks or swimming pools, but not including
 storage structures such as unattached garages or sheds.
- viii. Coops and fenced enclosures/runs shall be cleaned on a regular basis
 and remain free from undue accumulated waste, such as to cause
 odors reasonably detectable on adjacent properties.
- ix. All feed, except when placed for consumption by chickens/fowl, shall be kept in containers with tightly fitted lids that are rodent-proof.

 Storage vessels containing chicken feed shall be impervious to pests and vermin.
- x. The number of chickens/fowl shall be allowed per-acre on the following

 minimum lot sizes as follows:
 - 10,000 square feet to 2 acres = 6 chickens
 - <u>2.01 acres to 5 acres = 8 chickens</u>
 - 5.01 acres to 9.99 acres = 10 chickens
 - 1 acre to 1.99 acres = 4 chickens/fowl
 - 2 acres to 2.99 acres = 5 chickens/fowl

4 acres to 4.99 acres = 7 chickens/fowl
